Alberta Aboriginal People Living Off-Reserve Highlights

November 2013

- Alberta Aboriginal People living off-reserve had the lowest unemployment rate among Aboriginal People living off-reserve across Canada. The unadjusted three-month moving average unemployment rate was 7.8% in November 2013, down 0.6 percentage points from the previous month and down 4.7 percentage points from the same month last year. The national rate was 11.0%, down 0.4 percentage points from the month before.
- The labour force decreased by 100 and employment increased by 500 from October to November 2013.
- In November 2013, there were 86,900 employed Aboriginal people living off-reserve. This represents 3.9% of Alberta's overall employment.
- In the Edmonton Economic Region there were 28,900 Aboriginal people employed and in the Calgary Economic Region 22,700 were employed. In the rest of Alberta, 35,300 Aboriginal people were employed.
- The occupations that employed the greatest number of Aboriginal people off-reserve were: Sales and Service Occupations, 24,100; Trades, Transportation, Operators and Related Occupations, 23,100; and Business, Finance and Administrative Occupations, 12,700.
