Calgary appeal

May 4, 2021 (9:30 a.m.)

Const. M. Strong was suspended with pay while he was
the subject of an investigation. When Const. Strong
returned to work, he alleged that he was denied shift
differential and that his ability to write an exam was
delayed. Const. Strong appealed these administrative
decisions on the basis that they were disguised discipline.
The board will hear part one of this matter to determine if
the administrative decisions were disguised discipline.

Edmonton appeal

May 11, 2021 (9:30 a.m.)

Mr. C. Babchishin and Ms. L. Keith filed complaints
alleging that officers conducted an inadequate investigation
into the death of their son. They further allege that officers
failed to provide them with updates and did not respond to
their requests that an officer speak with them.

The Law Enforcement Review Board, an independent body established pursuant to the *Police Act* in 1973, reviews public complaints about police officer conduct and appeals from police officers on disciplinary action.
