Clostridium Perfringens

Albertan

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Case Definition

Confirmed Case

Clinical illness^(A) with laboratory confirmation of infection:

• Isolation of ≥ 10⁵ Clostridium perfringens organisms per gram^(B) from the stool or epidemiologically implicated food.^(C)

Probable Case

Clinical illness^(A) in a person who is epidemiologically-linked to a confirmed case.

^(A) Clinical illness is characterized in some cases by the sudden onset of nausea and vomiting, and in others by abdominal cramps and diarrhea.

⁽B) Isolation of C. perfringens in numbers less the 10⁵ organisms per gram may be indicative of normal flora only and not necessarily the causative agent.

^(C) Refer to the Public Health Laboratory (ProvLab) Guide to Services for current specimen collection and submission information.

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Reporting Requirements

Laboratories

All laboratories shall report all positive laboratory results by mail, fax or electronic transfer within 48 hours (two business days) to the:

- Chief Medical Officer of Health (or designate), and
- Medical Officer of Health (or designate) of the zone.

Alberta Health Services and First Nations and Inuit Health Branch

- Report outbreaks <u>only</u> using the <u>Alberta Outbreak Report Form</u>.
- Completion of a Notifiable Disease Report is <u>not</u> required.
