Program Description:

The EOP is for clients who desire a high school equivalency diploma (GED) to gain access to employment. The program also serves students who seek an expedient route to further training at a variety of post secondary institutions who accept the high school equivalency diploma as an entry credential.

The EOP requires a maximum of 24 weeks for completion. The program features preparation for the GED examination (written at NorQuest College typically during the 16th week) and transitions to further training or employment as significant outcomes. The program features:

- Classroom instruction with small classes and attention to personal learning requirements
- Basic computer instruction in Microsoft software
- Assisted job search and work experience placement are available
- Follow-up support for graduates

Job Search Edmonton offers two major service streams. Stream one is a short term program focused on job search. This training is ideal for persons with recent work history who have a clear occupational goal.

Stream two is a longer term program for clients who require employment preparation prior to job search. This stream is ideal for persons who are uncertain about their occupational goal or who have experienced difficulty either getting or keeping a job. Job Search Edmonton also offers on the job training for eligible clients.

Clients will find Job Search Edmonton staff to be approachable, highly skilled and motivated to help participants find and keep a job. Job Search Edmonton has all the tools participants will need to reach your goal.

Job Search Edmonton features:

- Individual and small group training
- A fully equipped resource centre with computer and telephone stations
- Basic computer skill training
- Access to employer hiring information
- Occupational planning
