Provider Description:

Careers in Transition (CIT) delivers Academic Upgrading and Skills Training programs to adult Albertans in their early twenties from training centres in Edmonton and Calgary.

The programs emulate the world of business rather than classroom to better prepare the student for future employment.

Target group: Clients aged 18 years and over who have completed some high school.

Program Description:

The EOP is for clients who desire a high school equivalency diploma (GED) to gain access to employment. The program also serves students who seek an expedient route to further training at a variety of post secondary institutions who accept the high school equivalency diploma as an entry credential.

The EOP requires a maximum of 24 weeks for completion. The program features preparation for the GED examination (written at NorQuest College typically during the 16th week) and transitions to further training or employment as significant outcomes. The program features:

- Classroom instruction with small classes and attention to personal learning requirements
- Basic computer instruction in Microsoft software
- Assisted job search and work experience placement are available
- Follow-up support for graduates

Group information sessions are held twice weekly at the office on an ongoing basis. These sessions present the student with details about the program, how the material will be presented and how the credential can be used for employment and/or further training.
