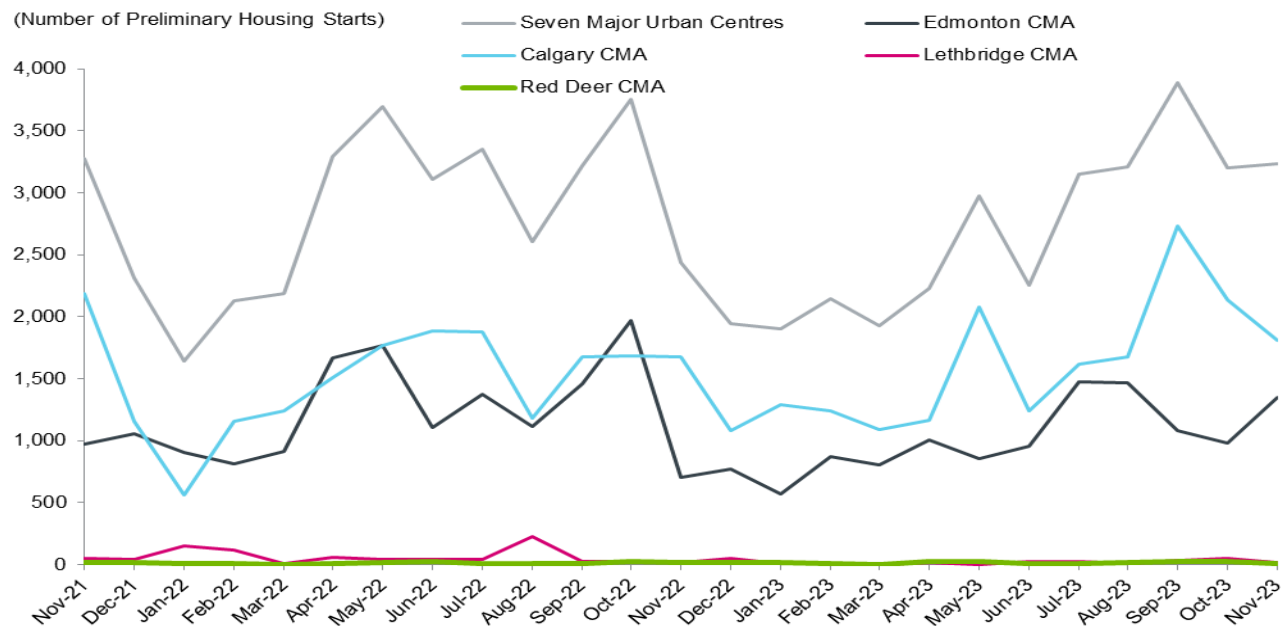


Alberta Official Statistics

Preliminary Total Housing Starts in Alberta's Major Urban Centres

- In November 2023, preliminary housing starts¹ in Alberta's seven major urban centres² increased by 1.2% from last month (from 3,198 in October, up to 3,235 in November), and increased by 32.6% from last year (2,440 starts in November 2022).
- Preliminary starts decreased in the Calgary Census Metropolitan Area (CMA) by 15.4% from last month (from 2,137 in October, down to 1,808 in November), and increased by 8.1% from last year (1,673 starts in November 2022).
- In the Edmonton CMA, preliminary starts increased by 37.8% from last month (from 979 in October, up to 1,349 in November), and increased by 91.9% from last year (703 starts in November 2022).
- Preliminary starts decreased in the Lethbridge CMA by 74.1% from last month (from 54 in October, down to 14 in November), and decreased by 30.0% from last year (20 starts in November 2022).
- In the Red Deer CMA, preliminary starts decreased 52.2% from last month (from 23 in October, down to 11 in November), and decreased 21.4% from last year (14 starts in November 2022).
