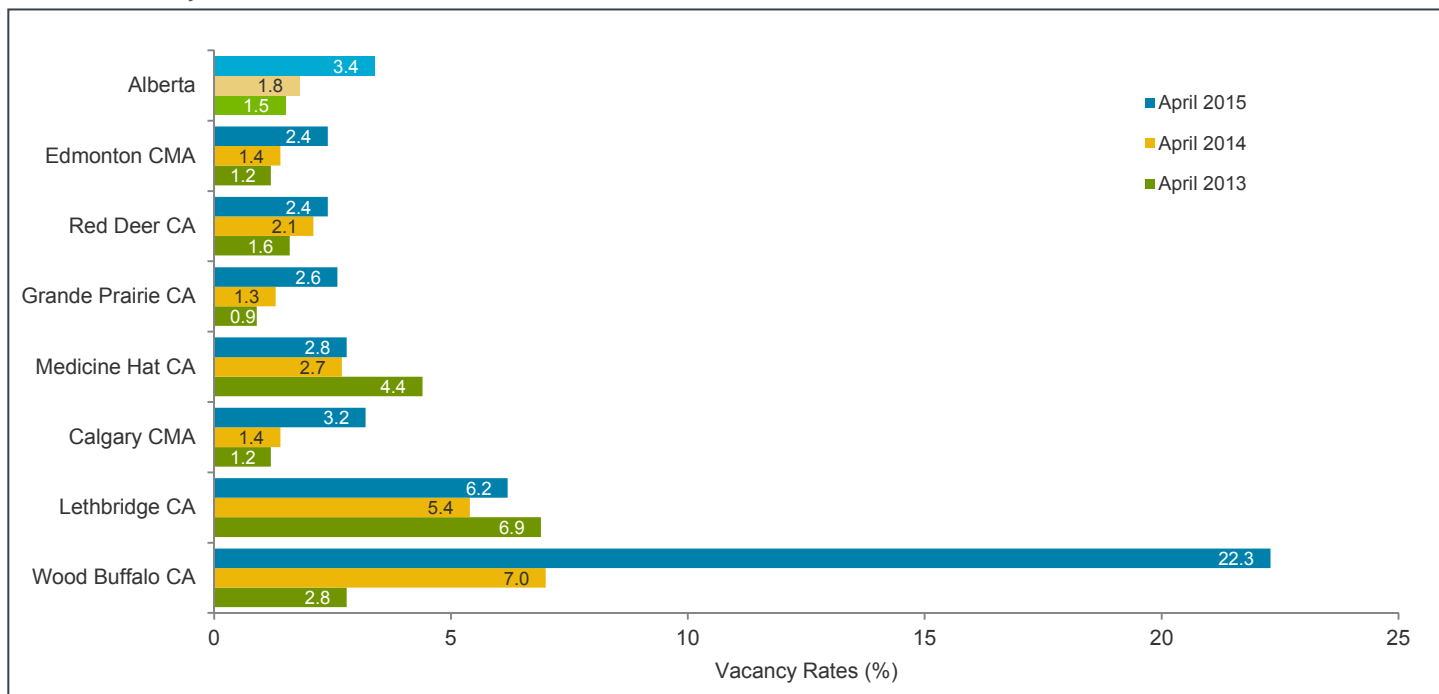
Average Vacancy Rates, Alberta and Major Alberta Urban Centres

- Average vacancy rate in private rental apartments in Alberta's urban centres with a population of 10,000 or more increased from 1.8% in April 2014 to 3.4% in April 2015.
- In April 2015, overall apartment vacancy rates across Alberta's major urban centres ranged from a low of 2.4% in the Red Deer CA and Edmonton CMA, to a high of 22.3% in the Wood Buffalo CA.
- Vacancy rates increased across Alberta's major urban centres. The largest increase was in the Wood Buffalo CA (22.3% in April 2015, up from 7.0% in April 2014).
