| Dose | 0.5 mL | |
| Route | Intramuscular injection | |
| Schedule | Two years of age and older: One dose Reinforcing dose – every three years for individuals at continued risk.² See Indications for use of provincially funded vaccine (above). | |
| Contraindications | Known severe hypersensitivity to any of the components of the vaccine or its container. Anaphylaxis or other severe allergic reaction to a previous dose of vaccine containing typhoid antigen. | |
| Precautions | Typhoid vaccines does not protect against will not provide protection against species of <i>Salmonella</i> other than <i>S.typhi</i> . ¹ . | |

| Pregnancy | No information is available on the safety in pregnancy; however, there is not theoretical reason to suspect an increased risk from inactivated vaccines. ² Typhoid vaccine should be considered for pregnant women when indicated. ² | |
| Lactation | Although there are no data, it is reasonable to assume that inactivated typhoid vaccine could be used safely in breastfeeding mothers. ² | |
