Labour Force Statistics Aboriginal People (Off-Reserve) December 2011

Alberta Aboriginal People Highlights:

- The unadjusted three-month moving average unemployment rate for Aboriginal People living off-reserve was 7.8% in December 2011, 0.4 percentage points lower than a month ago, and 2.1 percentage points lower than the same month last year.
- The unemployment rates for Aboriginal women fell from 7.2% in November to 6.3% in December. For men, the unemployment rate rose from 9.0% to 9.1% over the same period.
- The number of employed Aboriginal people in December 2011 was 2,800 higher than in December 2010.
- In December 2011, part-time employment for Aboriginal people increased by 400 while full-time employment decreased by 100.
- Between November and December, the three industries with the largest employment increase for Aboriginal people were Retail and Wholesale Trade, 900; Transportation and Warehousing, 900; and Health Care and Social Assistance, 500.
