

Labour Force Statistics Aboriginal People (Off-Reserve) November 2011

Alberta Aboriginal People Highlights:

- The unadjusted three-month moving average unemployment rate for Aboriginal People living off-reserve fell 2.5 percentage points in November from the previous month to 8.2%. This rate was 2.4 percentage points below the unemployment rate in the same month last year.
- The number of employed Aboriginal people increased by 1,500 in November as unemployment dropped 2,300 from the previous month.
- The unemployment rate for Aboriginal women declined 4.6 percentage points in November from the previous month to 7.2% and for Aboriginal men, it fell 0.7 percentage points to 9.0% during the same period.
- The number of employed Aboriginal People in Edmonton rose by 1,500, decreased by 500 in Calgary, and increased by 500 for the rest of Alberta, from the previous month.
- The three occupations with the largest employment increases were Health occupations, 600; Occupations in social science, education, government and religion, 600; and Sales and services occupations, 500 in November from the previous month.
