

Labour Force Statistics Aboriginal People (Off-Reserve) June 2011

Alberta Aboriginal People Highlights:

- The unadjusted three-month moving average unemployment rate for Aboriginal People living off-reserve was 15.3% in June 2011, higher than the previous month by 1.1 percentage points but lower by 0.1 percentage points from the same month last year.
- In June, the labour force for Aboriginal people increased by 2,100 and employment increased by 800 from the previous month.
- Year-over-year, the Aboriginal people's labour force decreased by 4,300 and employment decreased by 3,600.
- Full-time employment increased by 1,400 while part-time employment declined by 600 compared to May 2011.
- Between May 2011 and June 2011, employment for Aboriginal People living off-reserve increased by 1,600 in the Services-Producing Sector and declined by 600 in the Goods-Producing Sector.
