

Labour Force Statistics Aboriginal People (Off-Reserve) May 2011

Alberta Aboriginal People Highlights:

- The unadjusted three-month moving average unemployment rate for Aboriginal People living off-reserve was 14.2% in May 2011, higher than the previous month by 2.5 percentage points and lower by 2.0 percentage points from the same month last year.
- In May, the labour force for Aboriginal people increased by 700 and unemployment increased by 2,100 from the previous month.
- Year-over-year, the Aboriginal people's labour force decreased by 5,000 and employment decreased by 2,600.
- Full-time and part-time employment declined by 400 and 1,000 respectively compared to April 2011.
- Between April 2011 and May 2011, employment for Aboriginal People living off-reserve decreased by 1,900 in Edmonton, remained unchanged in Calgary and rose by 400 in the rest of Alberta.
