Labour Force Statistics Aboriginal People (Off-Reserve) April 2011

Alberta Aboriginal People Highlights:

- The unadjusted three-month moving average unemployment rate for Aboriginal People living off-reserve was 11.7% in April 2011, higher than the previous month by 1.8 percentage points and lower by 6.0 percentage points from the same month last year.
- In April, the labour force for Aboriginal people decreased by 1,300 and employment decreased by 2,600, from the previous month
- Year-over-year, the Aboriginal people's labour force decreased by 5,300 while employment rose by 300.
- Full-time employment for Aboriginal people was mainly unchanged, while part-time employment decreased by 2,500, from the previous month.
- Between March 2011 and April 2011, employment increased the most in the following industries: Construction, 2,200; Transportation and Warehousing, 400; and both Educational Services and Professional, Scientific and Technical Services, by 200.
