CAPITAL PROJECT

ALBERTA – ÉCOLE JOSEPH-MOREAU SCHOOL – COMMUNITY CENTRE

Target Years: 2018-2022¹

Project Description

The Francophone community is in need of additional community spaces to accommodate the recent surge in population growth. *École Joseph-Moreau* is currently located in an old school that was built in 1913 in the Ritchie neighbourhood, serving junior high school students for the greater Edmonton area. In the 1970's, an additional space was built to accommodate a gymnasium. The school is going to be replaced by a new construction that will be operating in the school year 2020-2021, including a new gymnasium that will be exclusively used during school hours by students and will not be available for community use. The immediate opportunity exists to preserve the existing freestanding gymnasium to be only dedicated as a community space, saving it from being demolished as initially planned.

The multi-year project will fund the renovation of the existing gymnasium to accommodate the community centre. The community space will be 638 m² and will require careful demolition work around the structure to preserve the gymnasium while the existing school's demolition will occur. A new air handling unit will be installed, LED lighting, roof replacement, modernization of interior and exterior finishes.

The gymnasium is currently highly used by community groups. The benefit of having this community centre available during regular school operating hours is to have a dedicated space for the Francophone community that can access the space without affecting school operations. The local Francophone community will use the space during the day for events, such as art and talent exhibits, sporting events and gatherings. As the neighbourhood is home to many local artists due to its proximity to the most culturally diverse area of Edmonton, the centre will also host cultural awareness events, fundraising events, meetings and provincial Francophone sporting events. For instance, the space will allow French youth organizations such as la Fédération du sport francophone de l'Alberta and the *Conseil scolaire Centre-Nord* to host province-wide sporting events (for example: the Francophone games of Alberta), creating bonds and friendships with students from across the province.

¹ The negotiation of the extension of the *Canada–Alberta Agreement on Minority-Language Education and Second–Language Instruction 2013-2014 to 2017-2018* to cover 2018-2019 fiscal year is currently underway. It is within this agreement that the contractual obligations for the capital projects will be confirmed for the project in question.

École Joseph-Moreau is located in the Ritchie neighbourhood serving junior high school students for the greater Edmonton area. A Francophone senior high-school is located in the neighbouring community of Bonnie-Doon (approximately 2.8 km away) and the elementary schools are located approximately 4.4 kilometers from *École Joseph-Moreau* in the Kenilworth and Stratheam neighbourhoods. Other areas served by the school include Meadowlark, Leduc, Sherwood Park, Beaumont, Fort-Saskatchewan and a portion of North-Edmonton.
