

Life Expectancy at Birth by Sex, Alberta and Alberta Health Services Continuum Zones

- Life expectancy ¹ is the number of years a person would be expected to live if the age- and sex- specific mortality rates that existed at that person's birth, prevailed throughout their lifetime.
- In 2014, Alberta's highest life expectancy at birth for both men (at 81.7 years) and women (at 85.2 years) was reported in the Calgary Zone.
- The Central Zone registered the lowest life expectancy for men at 77.6 years while the North Zone registered the lowest for women at 81.6 years.
- For the province as a whole, females' life expectancy at birth was 83.9 years, 4.2 years² higher than the males' (at 79.7 years).
- 1 The bars are estimates of the true value of life expectancy.
- 2 It is calculated based on rounded numbers.
