Labour Force Statistics Alberta Aboriginal People Living Off-Reserve Highlights June 2014

- Alberta Aboriginal people living off-reserve had the lowest unemployment rate in Canada. The unadjusted three-month moving average unemployment rate was 8.3% in June 2014, down 0.6 percentage points from May 2014 and down 0.4 percentage points from the same month last year. The national rate was 11.2%, down 0.4 percentage points from the month before.
- The unemployment rate decreased because the labour force decreased by 100 people and employment increased by 500 from May to June 2014.
- In the Edmonton Economic Region there were 38,000 Aboriginal people employed and in the Calgary Economic Region 16,500 were employed. In the rest of Alberta, 43,500 Aboriginal people were employed.
- Between May and June, the three industries with the most employment increases were: Manufacturing, 800; both Management of Companies and Administrative and Other Support Services, and Educational Services, 600.
