Average Alberta Weekly Earnings

Bargaining Update is a monthly report which provides information about the unionized workforce, primarily in Alberta.

- There are approximately 2,067,500 Albertans employed, of which about 357,700 are self-employed.
- Approximately 417,300 Albertans are covered by union agreements. Alberta's union coverage rate is 24.4% while nationwide the union coverage rate is 31.3%.
- Unemployment in Alberta decreased from 129,300 in January 2011 to 124,200 in February 2011, with the rate decreasing from 5.9% to 5.7%. Nationally, the seasonally adjusted unemployment rate remained virtually the same at 7.6% in January 2011 and February 2011, with the number of unemployed persons decreasing by 1,100 to a total of 1,448,500.

Highlights

Public Service Negotiations

The Government of Alberta and AUPE representing 21,000 direct government employees reached a memorandum of agreement on March 31, 2011. The agreement includes a 31-month term that would expire on March 31, 2013 and includes a lump sum payment of \$1,750 following ratification, a second payment of \$1,250 in January 2012 and a general wage increase of 4.0 per cent effective April 1, 2012. Also included is a \$750 annual health spending account effective April 1, 2012.

Following a series of town hall meetings throughout the province the union will conduct a mail-in ratification vote, which is expected to take a month to complete.

Calgary Handi-Bus Association

In the dispute between the Calgary Handi-Bus Association and the Amalgamated Transit Union, Local 583, the Minister of Employment and Immigration has appointed a Disputes Inquiry Board (DIB). No strike or lockout action can occur while the DIB is in place.

Canada Safeway Limited and UFCW

The UFCW will conduct strike votes in April concerning three disputes with Canada Safeway Limited. The collective agreements expired in March 2010. Mediators were appointed in February and mediation meetings took place in March of this year.

Over the first two weeks of April, UFCW Local 401 will conduct strike votes among 7,358 employees in the Retail group and 1,002 employees in the Meat, Delicatessen and Fish Departments in southern Alberta. On April 4, 6 and 7, 2011, UFCW Local 1118 will conduct a strike vote of 850 employees in the Meat, Delicatessen and Fish Departments in northern Alberta.

Recent Labour Relations Developments in Other Jurisdictions

British Columbia

The members of the Faculty Association at Vancouver Island University, based in Nanaimo, have been on strike since March 10, 2011. The employer placed ads in several local newspapers outlining the positions of the two parties on issues in bargaining. The Faculty Association considered the ads contained "false and defamatory" information, and expressed concern that the ads continued to run after they had raised objection. The Faculty Association has launched a defamation lawsuit against the University in this matter. Both sides are hoping for mediated bargaining sessions on the weekend of April 2 and 3, 2011 to try to reach agreement and end the strike.

More than 700 members of the Steelworkers, Local 9346 with the Teck Coal Elkview Mine near Sparwood have been on strike since late January. The current collective agreement expired on October 31, 2010. On March 26, 2011, the employees rejected (57 per cent of those voting against) an employer offer for a five year agreement. The Steelworkers have indicated they are putting together a package (an offer) to present to Teck.

Saskatchewan

The Saskatchewan Association of Health Organizations (SAHO) rejected a proposal from the Health Sciences Association of Saskatchewan (HSAS) on March 23, 2011. In the offer, the HSAS proposed elimination of a market supplement program and wage increases that vary with each position. Both the HSAS and SAHO want competitive wages, but cannot agree on what is competitive. The HSAS considers it necessary to bring Saskatchewan wages in line with Alberta, while SAHO is of the view it is preferable to use the three other western provinces as a whole for comparison. More than 3,000 para-professional and technical employees are represented by the HSAS throughout the province. The last contract with SAHO expired on March 31, 2009. The HSAS members voted 88 per cent in favour of strike action in February 2011, at the same time rejecting a SAHO offer. The offer included a 5.5 per cent wage increase over four years. SAHO then tabled an offer on March 11, 2011 with a 7.5 per cent increase over four years, with retroactive pay limited to March 31, 2011. The HSAS has renewed a call for arbitration to settle the dispute. The parties are governed by the *Essential Services Act*, allowing strikes and lockouts, but with about 50 per cent of HSAS members declared essential and required to remain at work during a labour dispute.

Ontario

Unionized workers at the Windsor Star newspaper, represented by the CAW, Local 240, CEP, Local 557G, and CWA (Communication Workers of America) – Guild, Local 30553 voted 96 per cent in favour of a strike mandate on March 27, 2011. The main issues in dispute are job security, post-retirement benefits, and a "half-pay letter", which would entitle employees at the age of 60 to retire early and continue receiving half their salary. The current agreement expired December 31, 2011. It is expected the parties will be meeting with an Ontario Ministry of Labour conciliator (mediator) in April 2011.

New Brunswick

A five-week lockout by Moosehead Brewery involving 170 production and maintenance employees, represented by the New Brunswick Union of Private and Public Employees, ended on March 26, 2011. No details on the agreement have been released. The dispute centered on Moosehead wanting to stop fully covering post-retirement medical benefits.

Nova Scotia

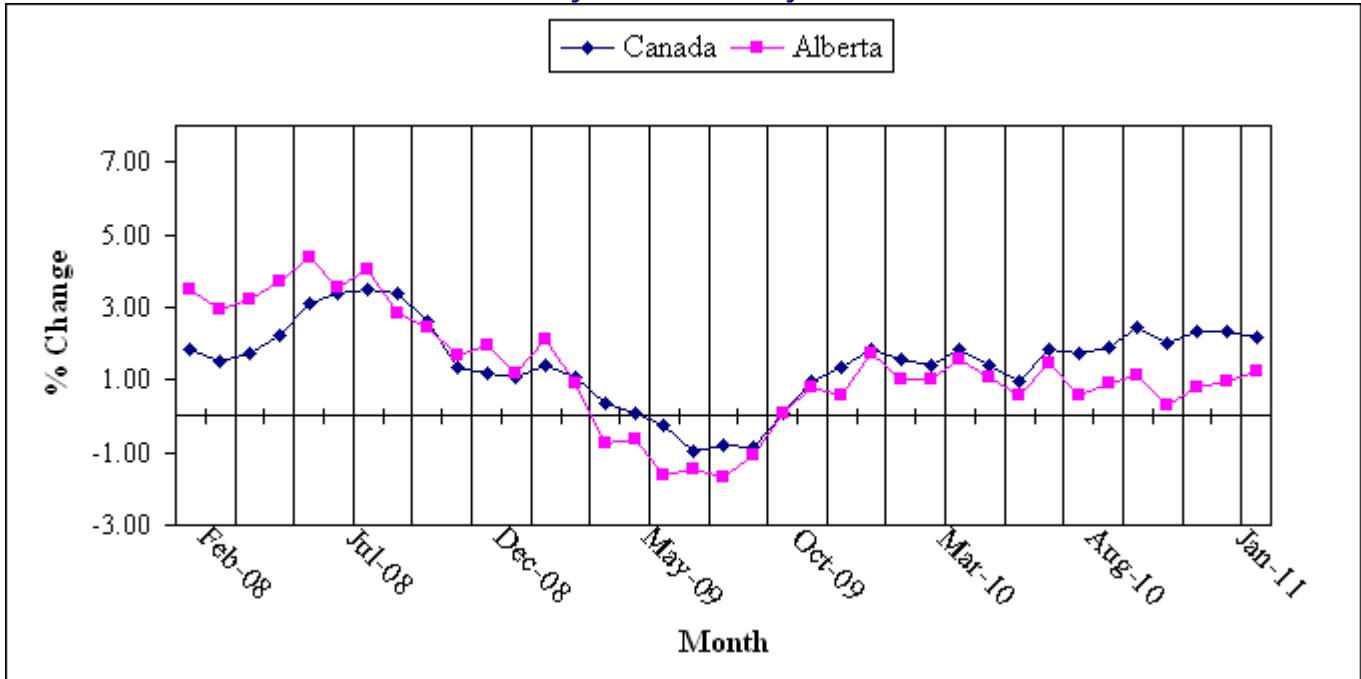
A tentative agreement has been reached between the Capital District Health Authority and the Nova Scotia Government and General Employees Union, Local 42. About 3,900 health care workers are involved in more than 170 job classifications, including medical laboratory technologists, licensed practical nurses, social workers, respiratory therapists, paramedics, and pharmacists. Information sessions on the tentative agreement will be held by the union before ratification votes are conducted. Terms of the agreement have not been released, pending ratification.

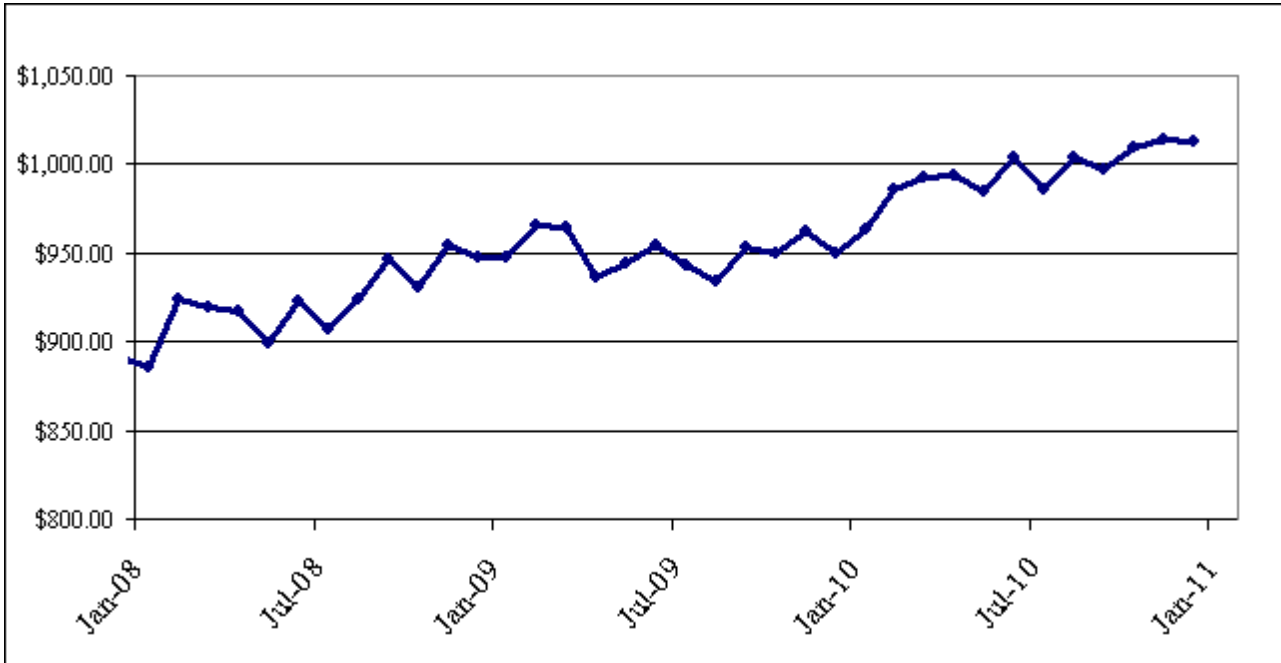
