The data in this issue are derived from 51 settlements received by the Department during the month of July 2011. These agreements covered approximately 6,588 employees, 75% of whom were in the private sector.

Approximately 411,400 Albertans are covered by union agreements. Alberta's union coverage rate is 23.63% while nationwide the union coverage rate is 31.75%.

Unemployment in Alberta increased from 117,300 in May 2011 to 123,000 in June 2011, with the rate increasing from 5.4% to 5.6%. Nationally, the seasonally adjusted unemployment rate remained virtually unchanged at 7.4% in June 2011, with the number of unemployed persons increasing by 13,500 to a total of 1,387,600.

#### Highlights

#### Gate Gourmet

The dispute between Gate Gourmet Canada Inc. (Cara Operations Limited – Edmonton) and the UFCW Local 401, ended after 78 days of strike/lockout when the parties reached a ratified agreement. Fifty seven employees were involved.

#### **University of Alberta**

A ratified agreement has been reached between the University of Alberta and the Association of Academic Staff, involving seven bargaining units representing 2,800 employees.

#### Extendicare (Canada) Inc.

In the first agreement dispute between Extendicare (Canada), Michener Hill and AUPE, the parties have accepted the recommendation of the Disputes Inquiry Board.

#### City of Calgary

A ratified agreement has been reached between the City of Calgary and CUPE Local 37 (outside workers).

#### Lakeside Packers

A ratified agreement has been reached between XL Foods Inc. Lakeside Packers in Brooks and the UFCW Local 401.

#### Saskatchewan

In June 2011, the Saskatchewan Labour Relations Board (LRB) rejected allegations of unfair labour practices by the UFCW against Walmart. This matter dates back to the UFCW's organizing drive at the Weyburn store in 2004. The LRB ruling dismissed union claims that Walmart had communicated with employees in a misleading or coercive manner, that Walmart had closed a store in Quebec to intimidate Saskatchewan employees from joining the union, and that the company had illegally communicated or interfered with employees in a decertification application to the LRB. The UFCW had obtained a certification order from the LRB in 2008, which was overturned by the Court of Queen's Bench in June 2009, but was restored by the Saskatchewan Court of Appeal in October 2010. In December 2010, employees voted to decertify the union, but, following legal appeals by the union, the ballot boxes remained sealed. It was the position of the UFCW that the employees should have been allowed to wait for the outcome of the negotiation process on a first collective agreement before being allowed to conduct a decertification vote. The LRB ruling in June 2011 ordered the counting of the ballots from the decertification vote taken by the employees in December 2010. The LRB ruling, including the order to count the ballots, has been appealed by the UFCW, and will be considered by the Court of Queen's Bench in Saskaton on August 11, 2011.

#### Ontario

A strike by 48 Steelworkers at Infinity Rubber in Etobicoke has entered its twentieth month. The workers are receiving \$350 a week in strike pay, less than half their former wages. The strike began in late 2009 when Infinity Rubber offered the employees a 25 per cent reduction in wages and a 50 per cent cut in benefits. Infinity Rubber acquired the assets of the predecessor company, Biltrite Rubber Inc., in 2009 after Biltrite was operating under bankruptcy protection. The former Biltrite CEO is now the Infinity CEO. Most of the striking workers are third world immigrants, and the average age is 55. The plant continues to operate with replacement workers. From an employer perspective, plant managers have made financial sacrifices, remortgaging their homes and taking a 25 per cent cut in pay to keep the company going. Infinity also claims it has lost over \$1 million in security, legal, and other costs associated with the strike. No further bargaining sessions are currently planned. #### Quebec

A strike at CTV Montreal's news operation has been averted, at least for the time being. Earlier this month, 80% of the 126 reporters, camera operators, office staff and video editors, represented by the CEP, voted in favour of strike action. The parties have agreed to a moratorium on job action, and all issues in dispute have been resolved, except salary increases. #### Newfoundland and Labrador

An employer/union partnership is being implemented to address anticipated labour shortages in the province. The Newfoundland and Labrador Construction Labour Relations Association and the province's Building and Trades Council plan to form a committee to take action in this matter. Labour shortages are anticipated with several large construction projects on the books, including Hebron (offshore oil) and Muskrat Falls (hydro power). It is anticipated that a complete database will be developed of what jobs will be needed and in which trades. The Building Trades Council will be the primary resource for finding workers, but workers could also be recruited from the rest of Canada, the United States, or elsewhere in the world. #### **United States**

In a secret ballot election conducted by the National Labour Relations Board, workers at the Swedwood plant in Danville, Virginia have voted to be represented by the International Association of Machinists and Aerospace Workers (Machinists), an affiliate of the Building and Wood Workers International (BWI). The vote was 221 workers in favour of the union (76%) and 69 against. The union will soon be attempting to negotiate a first collective agreement with the employer. The Swedwood plant assembles IKEA products.


#### New Zealand

The national Fire Service is resuming talks with the Professional Firefighters Union, after talks broke down last week. The dispute is the latest in a string of difficult collective bargaining negotiations over the past year, as high inflation rates outgrow salary increases. The New Zealand inflation rate currently sits at a 21-year high of 5.3 per cent. The Firefighters are asking for an 8.75 per cent increase over one year, while the Fire Service is offering 2.5 per cent. The Post Primary Teachers' Association recently settled a high-profile pay dispute. The union had asked for a 4 per cent pay raise for teachers, but, after nearly a year of negotiations and strike action, accepted a settlement of 2.9 per cent in April 2011.


