
## Food Manufacturing Industries, Sales and Employed Labour Force, Alberta

- Preliminary estimates for 2014 indicate that Alberta food processing industries generated a record \$12.7 billion in sales, an increase of 10.1% over the revised estimate of \$11.5 billion in 2013.
- Food industries accounted for 16.0% of the total value of all goods manufactured in the province in 2014 (\$79.4 billion). Meat products industries (including poultry) remains the province's largest food sector accounting for 55.2% or \$7.0 billion of total food products sales.
- In 2014, food manufacturing industries was the second largest employer in Alberta's manufacturing sector after fabricated metal product workers (24,600 or 17.0%). There were 22,700 Albertans employed in food industries or 15.7% of total manufacturing workers.
