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Current Economic Indicators August 2012 Highlights

Labour Force: The unemployment rate in Alberta in July remained unchanged from June's 4.6%. Unemployment fell by 900 between June and July while the number of people employed and the size of the labour force increased by 5,800 and 4,900, respectively. Alberta's unemployment rate remains the lowest in Canada and is well below the national average of 7.3%. Over the past 12 months, the number of people employed increased by 2.2% or by 45,700. This is the highest growth rate registered by any province and is more than double the national growth rate of 0.8%. The largest employment gains were in construction (up 30,500), mining and oil and gas extraction (up 24,300) and transportation and warehousing (up 11,900). In May, the number of Albertans receiving regular Employment Insurance benefits decreased by 30.3% from May 2011 to 24,040.

Consumer Spending: In May, the value of retail sales rose by 8.9% from May 2011 to \$5.7 billion. From January to May 2012, retail trade increased by 9.4% from the same period last year. The number of vehicles sold increased by 5.8% between June 2011 and June 2012. Albertans paid 0.9% more for the goods and services that comprise the Consumer Price Index in July than they did in July 2011.

Construction: Alberta urban housing starts rose by 25.6% in July, compared to the same month in 2011. On a year-to-date basis, urban housing starts rose by 46.6% from the same period in 2011: single-detached starts rose by 13.0% and multiple starts more than doubled. Municipalities in Alberta issued \$1.0 billion in building permits in June, up 4.4% from June 2011 mainly as a result of a 95.1% increase in industrial permits. Residential permits also increased by 6.2% over the same period. In the first half of 2012, the value of Alberta

building permits rose 15.5% from the same period last year, to \$7.0 billion.

Energy: In May, production of crude oil rose by 26.3% as compared to the same month in 2011 while natural gas production fell by 2.7%. In July, the number of active drilling rigs fell by 17.5% from July 2011 to 198. The average number of active drilling rigs rose by 0.6% between January and July as compared to January to July of 2011.

Manufacturing: In June, the value of Alberta manufacturing shipments rose 5.8% from June 2011, to \$6.0 billion. The largest increases were registered by computer and electronics (up 48.2%), wood products (up 22.8%), machinery (up 21.6%) and metal fabricating (up 19.8%). On a year-to-date basis, Alberta manufacturing shipments rose by 10.6% from the same period in 2011.

Exports: In June, the value of international merchandise exports fell by 1.1%, compared to June 2011, to \$7.7 billion. Exports of manufactured goods rose by 1.1% while exports of primary agriculture and mining and energy sectors fell by 8.5% and 1.6%, respectively. Between January to June of 2011 and January to June of 2012, Alberta exports increased by 9.2% to \$48.8 billion as primary agriculture, mining and energy, and the manufacturing exports rose by 19.4%, 9.6% and 5.5%, respectively.

Bankruptcies and Incorporations: In May, business bankruptcies were up 27.3% from May 2011 and consumer bankruptcies fell by 16.5% over the same period. The number of business incorporations increased by 3.2% between July 2011 and July 2012 to 3,018. Between January and July of 2012, business incorporations rose by 0.5% from the same period in 2011.

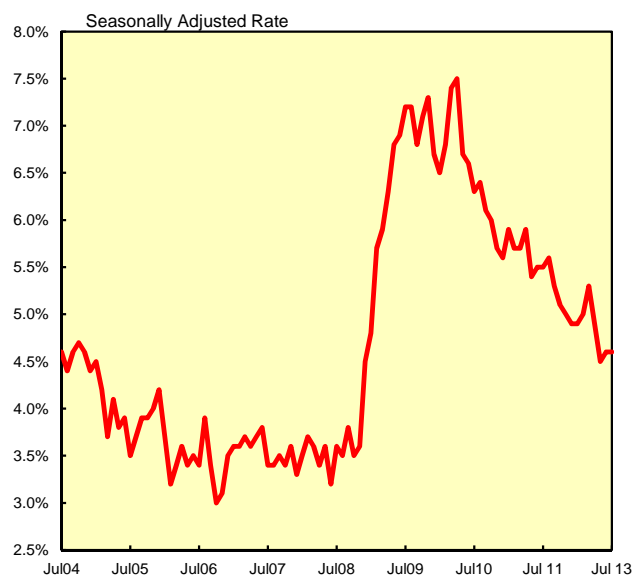

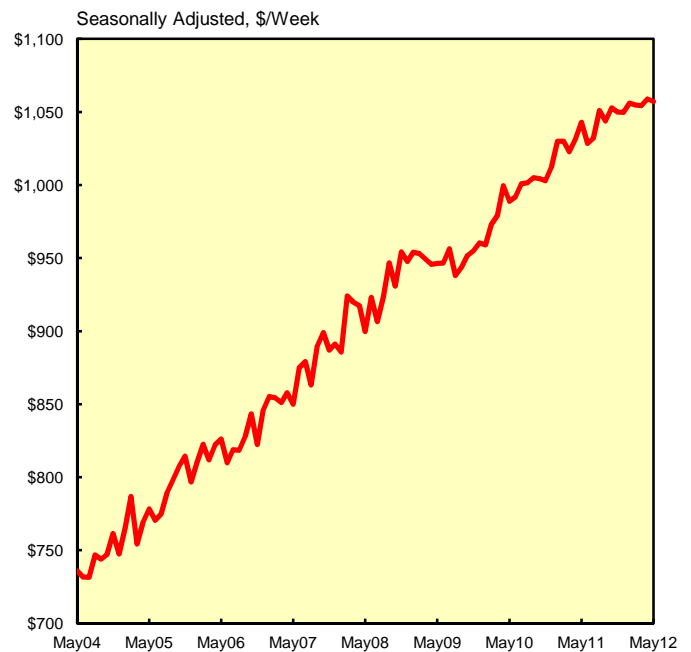

NEW MOTOR VEHICLE SALES



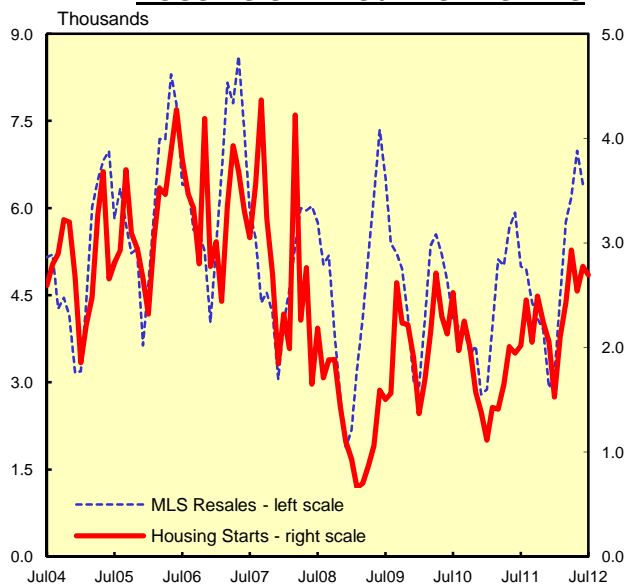

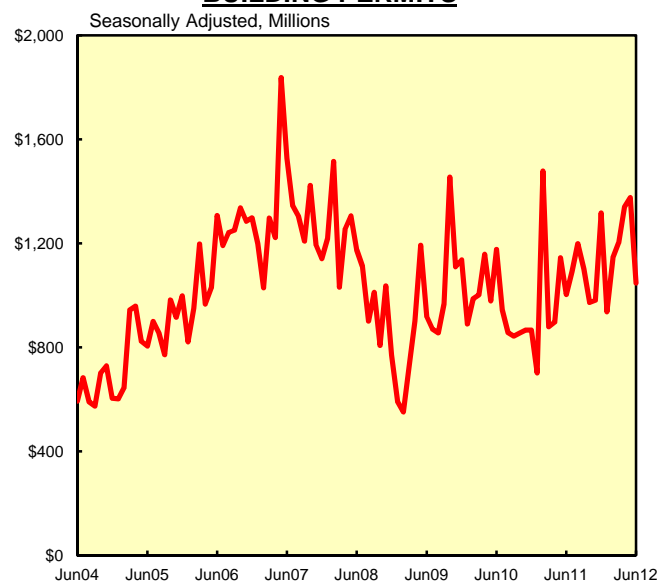

BUILDING PERMITS



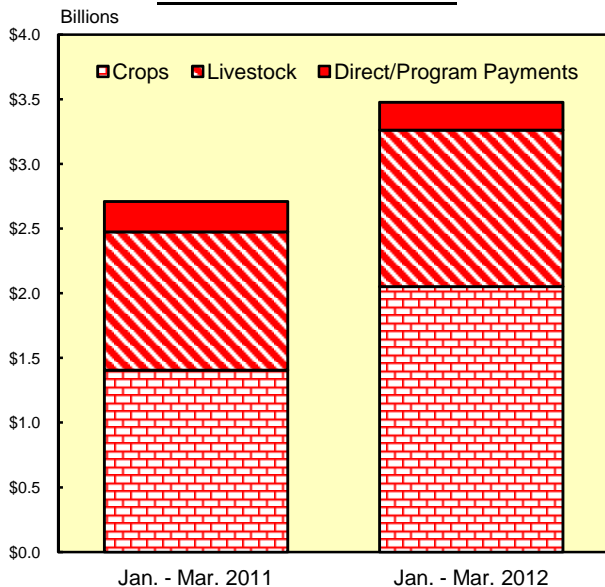

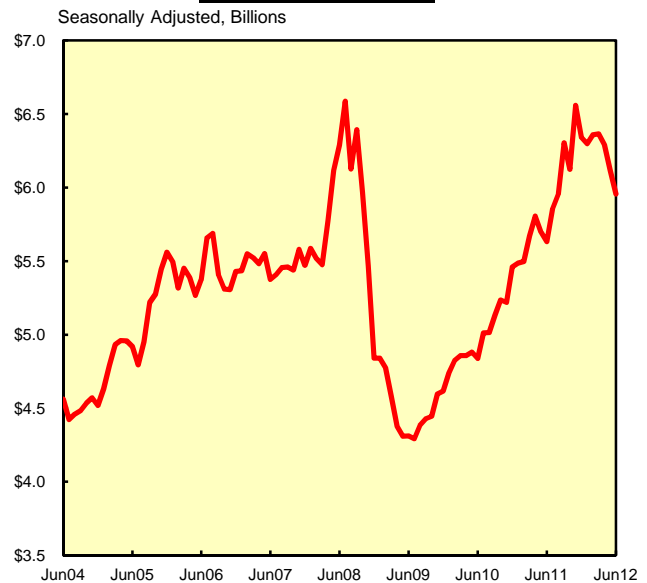

UNEMPLOYMENT RATE ALBERTA REGIONS

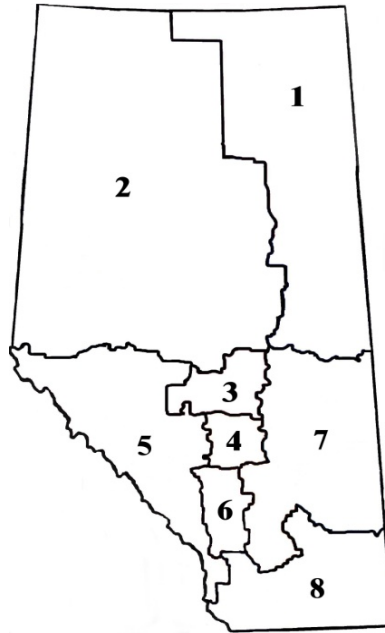


5-YEAR POPULATION GROWTH RATE ALBERTA REGIONS

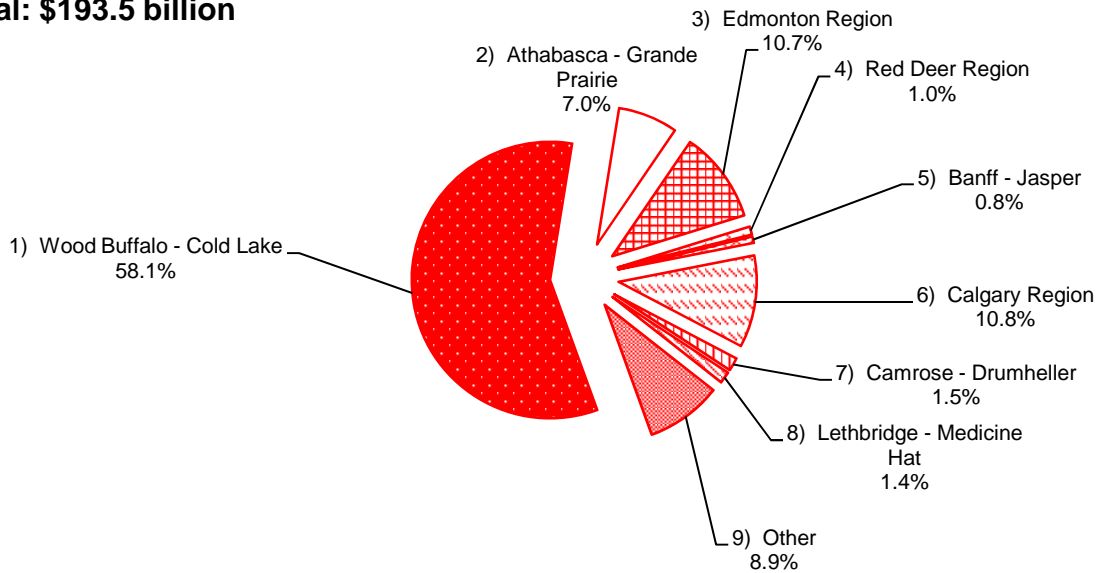
