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**Current Economic Indicators**  
**November 2013**  
**Highlights**

**Labour Force:** Alberta's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.4% in October 2013, up from September's 4.3% and second to Saskatchewan's 3.6%. The size of the labour force in Alberta increased by 3,500 and employment increased by 700 over the same period. Nationally, the unemployment rate was 6.9%. Over the last 12 months, the number of employed people in Alberta increased by 74,800. Alberta's 3.6% gain was the largest in the country. This increase was driven mostly by job gains in the service sectors, such as accommodation and food services (up 15,700), healthcare and social assistance (up 13,900) and construction (up 10,700). In September, there were 29,140 employment insurance recipients in Alberta, down 2.0% from September 2012.

**Consumer Spending:** In September 2013, Alberta retail sales rose 6.3% from September 2012 to \$6.2 billion. The largest increase was noted for motor and recreational vehicles (up 11.4%). Year-to-date retail sales rose 6.4%, compared to the same period in 2012. In September, the number of new motor vehicles sold rose 2.1% from the same month in 2012. Year-to-date automobile sales rose 6.1% from the same period in 2012. In October, the number of residential home re-sales via the Multiple Listing Service increased by 16.1%, compared to October 2012. On a year-to-date basis, MLS sales were 9.2% higher than in the same period of 2012. In October, Albertans paid 1.0% more for the goods and services that comprise the Consumer Price Index than they did in October 2012.

**Construction:** In October, urban housing starts in Alberta rose 7.3% from October 2012: single dwelling starts rose 9.0% and multiple starts 5.7%. Housing starts in Calgary and Edmonton increased by 18.6% and 11.0%, respectively. On a year-to-date basis Alberta starts rose 6.2%. In September, the value of Alberta building permits rose by

21.6% from the same month last year to \$1.4 billion. Year-to-date, the value of Alberta building permits rose 20.0% from the same period in 2012, the largest provincial increase.

**Energy:** In August, production volumes of crude oil increased by 9.0% from August 2012, while the production of natural gas rose 0.6% over the same period. On a year-to-date basis, crude oil production has risen 6.1% in 2013, while gas production has declined by 5.0%. In October, the number of active drilling rigs was 239, up 1.3% from October 2012. On a year-to-date basis, the number of active drilling rigs fell 5.2%.

**Exports:** Between September 2012 and September 2013, Alberta's merchandise exports rose by 16.8% to \$8.6 billion, mostly as a result of a 26.6% rise in mining and energy exports. Manufacturing exports rose 0.3% while primary agricultural exports fell 20.2%. Year-to-date exports rose 5.9% to \$76.7 billion. Nationally, exports rose by 2.5% over the same period.

**Bankruptcies and Incorporations:** In August 2013, the number of business and consumer bankruptcies decreased by 30.0% and 16.5%, respectively. On a year-to-date basis, business bankruptcies fell 45.6% to 87 and consumer bankruptcies fell 18.6% to 3,324. In October, the number of business incorporations rose 7.3%, as compared to the same month in 2012, to 3,961.

**Farm Cash Receipts:** In the third quarter of 2013, farm cash receipts were down 3.4% from the same quarter of 2012 due to an 18.1% fall in crop receipts. Livestock receipts rose 5.1% and direct payments 50.0% over the same period. Year-to-date, total farm cash receipts rose 2.1%, as compared to the same period in 2012, to \$9.1 billion, as a result of a 1.5% increase in crop receipts and a 32.1% increase in direct payments.

### NEW MOTOR VEHICLE SALES






