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## Current Economic Indicators February 2012 Highlights

**Labour Force:** In January, Alberta's unemployment rate remained unchanged from December's 4.9% as the growth in the size of the labour force slightly outpaced the 1,900 rise in the number employed. January's unemployment rate remains the lowest provincial unemployment rate in the country. Nationally, the unemployment rate was 7.5%. On a year-over-year basis, employment in January rose 79,500 or by 3.9% from January 2011, well above the national growth rate of 0.7%. Significant employment gains were registered in the following industries: retail trade (up 29,900) healthcare and social assistance (up 24,500), and mining and oil and gas extraction (up 17,400).

**Consumer Spending:** The value of retail sales rose 8.3% in November 2011, from a year earlier, to \$5.6 billion. The largest increases were registered for gasoline service stations, clothing and accessories, and motor and recreational vehicle sales: up 20.5%, 16.0% and 15.3%, respectively. Year-to-date, Alberta retail sales rose 7.0%, compared with the January to November period of 2010 with the highest increase of 20.8% recorded for gasoline service stations.

**Construction:** The total number of urban housing starts increased by 37.1% in January, compared to the same month in 2010, as a result of a 67.8% increase in multiple dwelling starts. In December 2011, the value of building permits rose 50.6% compared to the same month in 2010,

as a result of strong growth in commercial, institutional and residential permits. On an annual basis, building permits rose 11.2% between 2010 and 2011, to \$12.7 billion. In 2011, commercial, industrial and residential permits rose 29.8%, 21.6% and 5.0%, respectively, while institutional permit values fell by 18.5%.

**Energy:** In January 2012, the average number of drilling rigs increased by 7.8% to 401 as compared to January 2011. Between November 2010 and November 2011, production of natural gas fell by 3.3% while crude oil production rose by 3.2% from a year earlier. In 2011, the average price of crude oil was US\$95.12 per barrel and the average price of natural gas was C\$3.28 per gigajoule.

**Exports:** In December 2011, the value of Alberta's merchandise exports rose by 14.5% to \$8.7 billion from December 2010. Exports of primary agriculture, mining and energy, and manufacturing rose 45.7%, 16.4% and 3.6%, respectively. On an annual basis, Alberta exports rose by 18.3% from 2010 to \$93 billion in 2011. Primary agriculture, mining and energy, and manufacturing exports rose by 38.1%, 20.5% and 9.2%, respectively.

**Incorporations:** In January 2012, 3,809 businesses were incorporated in Alberta, 5.3% more than what was recorded a year ago. In 2011, 5.6% more companies were incorporated in Alberta than in 2010.

### NEW MOTOR VEHICLE SALES





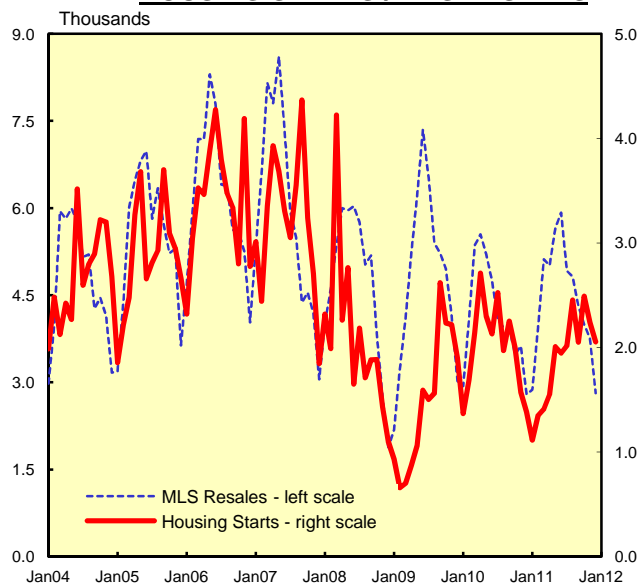

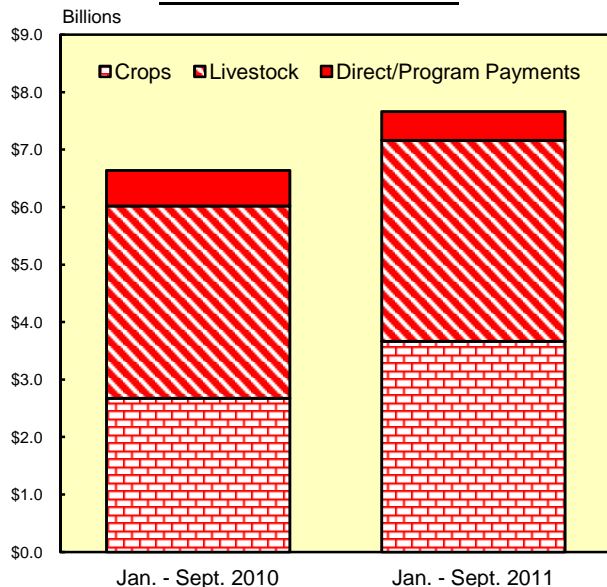

## UNEMPLOYMENT RATE ALBERTA REGIONS

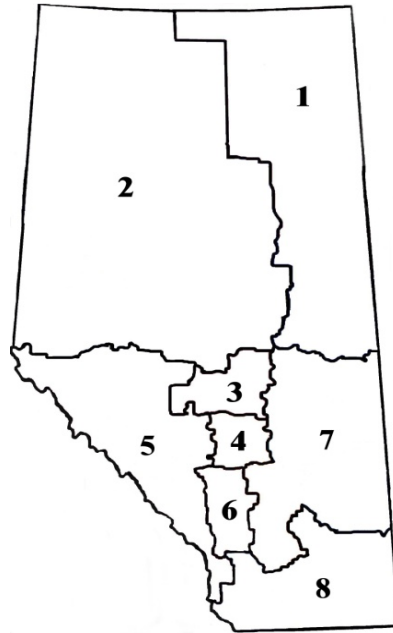


## 5-YEAR POPULATION GROWTH RATE ALBERTA REGIONS

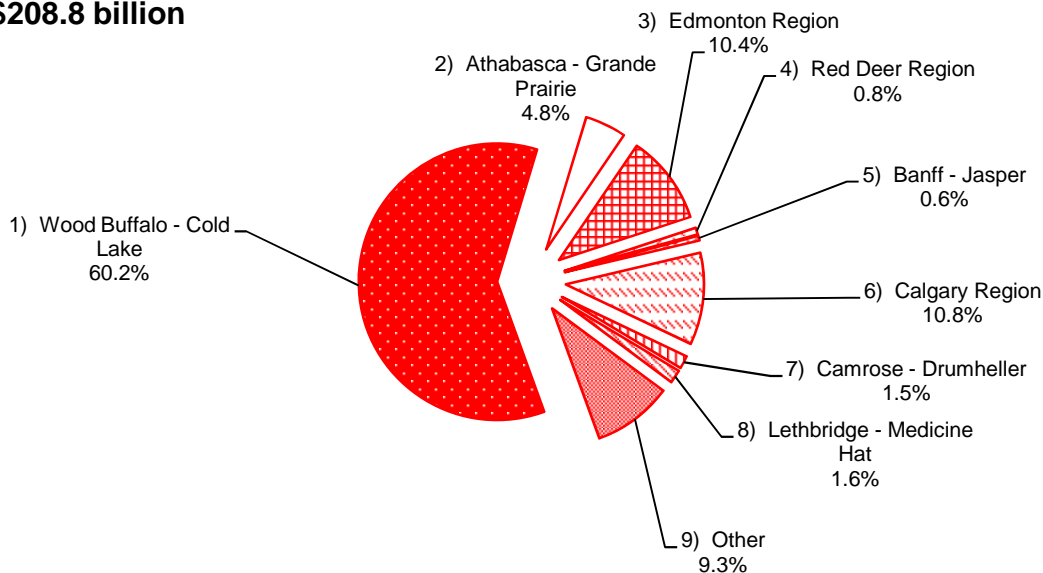
