Current Economic Indicators July 2012 Highlights

Labour Force: In June 2012, Alberta's unemployment rate inched up from May's 4.5% to 4.6%. The rise in the unemployment rate was due to a fall in employment (down 8,600) which outpaced a fall in the size of the labour force (down 6,900). Alberta's 4.6% unemployment rate is now the lowest provincial unemployment rate in the country. Nationally, the unemployment rate was 7.2% in June. As compared to June 2012, employment gains totalled 55,400. Sizeable job gains were noted for mining and oil and gas extraction (up 36,000), construction (up 23,500), and transportation and warehousing (up 16,400) in Alberta. In April, there were 24,630 employment insurance (EI) recipients in Alberta, down 34.3% from the same month in 2012.

Consumer Spending: In April 2012, the value of retail sales rose by 7.8% from 12 months earlier to \$5.7 billion. Year-to-date, retail trade rose 9.5% from the same period in 2011. Nationally, retail sales increased by 4.1% over the same period. In June, the number of Alberta homes sold via the Multiple Listing Service rose 8.1%, compared to the same month in 2011. Albertans paid 0.4% more for the goods and services that comprise the Consumer Price Index in May than they did in May 2011. Nationally, consumer prices rose 1.2% over the same period.

Construction: Urban housing starts in Alberta rose 42.6% in June 2012, compared to the same month of 2011. On a year-to-date basis, urban housing starts totalled 14,730, 51.2% more than the total number of starts recorded over the same period in 2011. Between May 2011 and May 2012, the value of building permits issued by Alberta municipalities rose by 26.0%. This increase was the result of sharp increases in institutional, industrial and residential permits. From January to May 2012, Alberta building permits rose by 19.0% from the same period in 2011 to \$6.1 billion. This compares to a national increase of 10.5% over the same period.

Manufacturing: In May, Alberta's manufacturing shipments rose 6.3% to \$6.1 billion from May 2011. The largest increases of 58.1%, 19.3%,

and 18.9% were registered for the computer and electronics, metal fabricating and non-metallic mineral products sectors respectively. For the year-to-date, Alberta's manufacturing shipments rose by 11.1%. Industries that registered large increases in shipments include computer and electronics (up 50.5%), machinery (up 28.5%) and metal fabricating (up 26.9%). Nationally, manufacturing shipments rose by 4.9% over the same period.

Energy: Between April 2011 and April 2012, production of natural gas fell by 3.6% while crude oil production rose by 11.7%. In June, the average number of active drilling rigs was 139, 7.3% less than the number of rigs that were drilling in June 2011. On a year-to-date basis the average number of drilling rigs increased by 3.5% as compared to the same period in 2011.

Exports: Alberta's merchandise exports rose 3.1% between May 2011 and May 2012. Year-to-date, exports increased by 12.3% from the same period in 2011 to \$41.2 billion. Primary agriculture exports rose 25.0% while mining and energy exports and manufacturing exports rose by 13.2% and 6.5%, respectively. Nationally, exports rose 6.0% over the same period.

Incorporations and Bankruptcies: In April, business bankruptcies were up 17.6% from April 2011 and consumer bankruptcies fell by 18.3% over the same period. Year-to-date, business bankruptcies fell 11.6% from a year ago while consumer bankruptcies fell 15.5%. In June, Alberta's business incorporations increased by 1.4% from June 2011 to 3,483. For the first six months of the 2012, there were 0.1% more business incorporations than for the same period in 2011.

Population: On April 1, 2012, Alberta's population was 3,847,119, up 2.4% from April 1, 2011. This was the largest provincial population increase and can be attributed to increases of both interprovincial in-migrants and international immigrants in the first quarter of 2012. Nationally, population rose by 1.1% as compared to April 1, 2011.

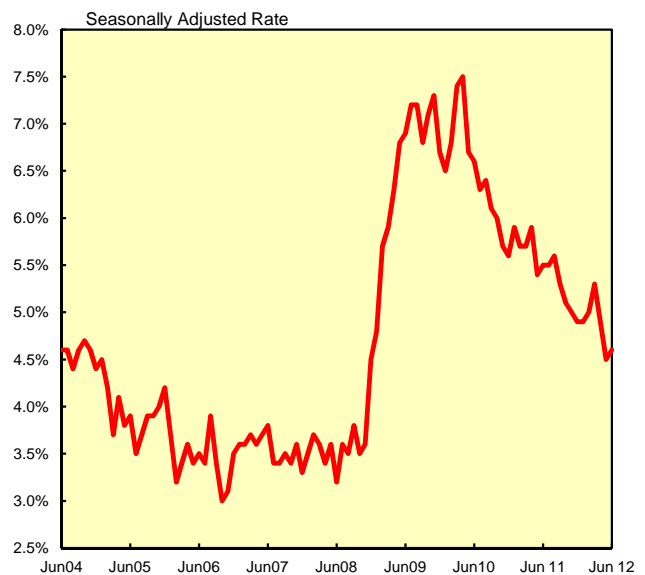

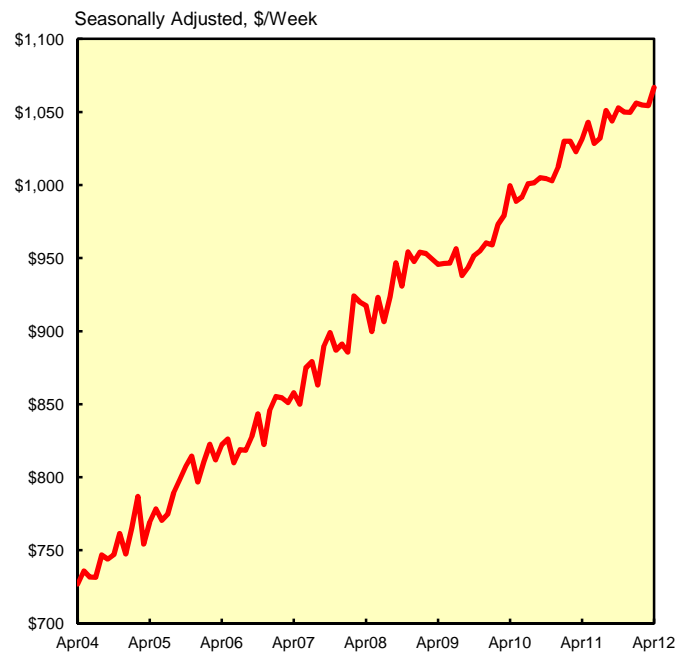

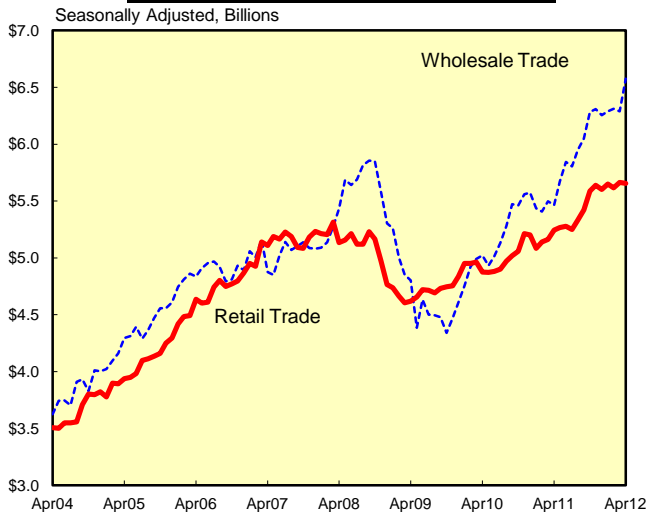

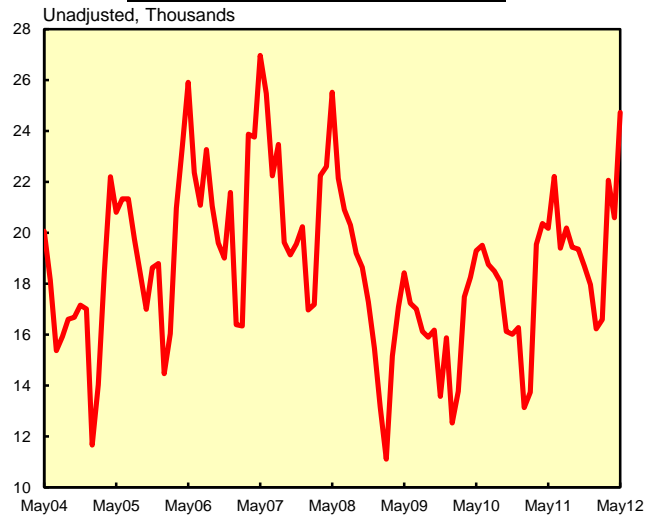

NEW MOTOR VEHICLE SALES



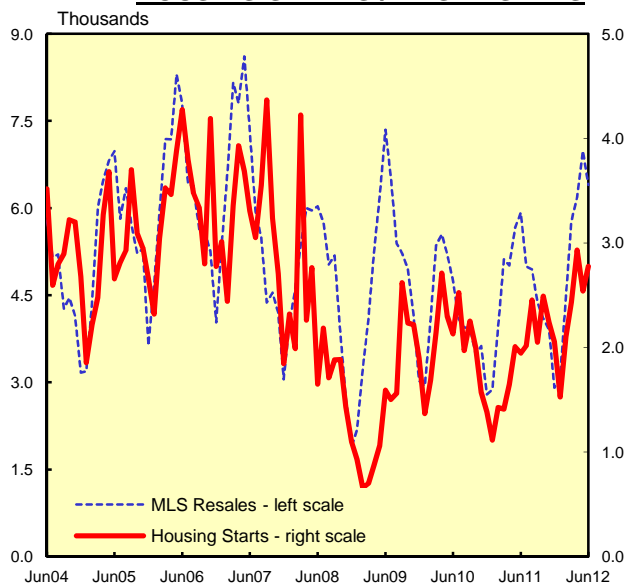

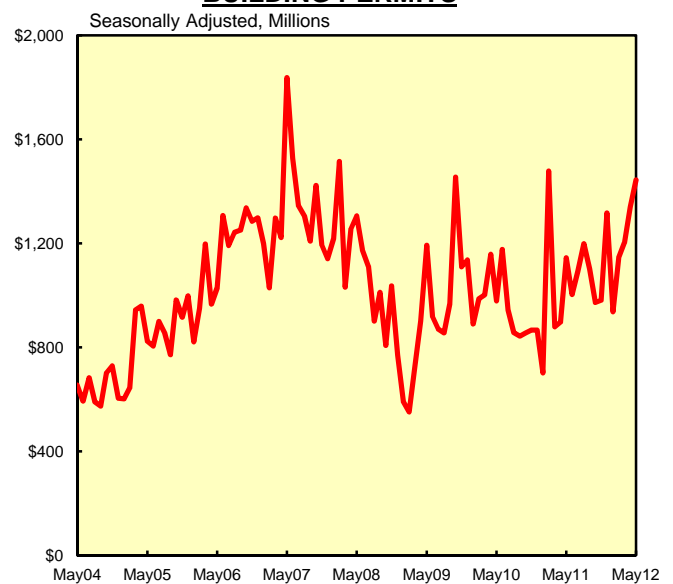

BUILDING PERMITS



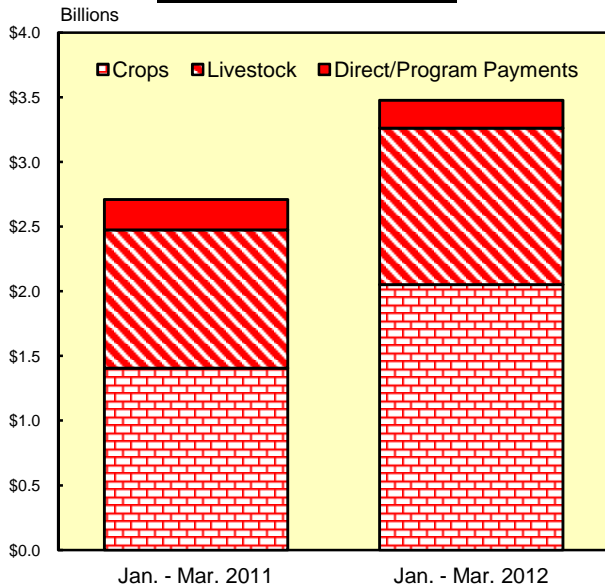

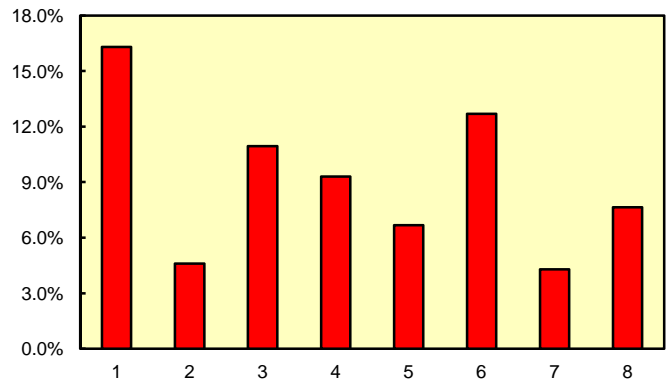
