Highlights

Labour Force: In May, Alberta's unemployment rate was 4.5%, down from April's 4.9%. Alberta and Saskatchewan had the lowest provincial unemployment rate in May. The large fall in Alberta's unemployment rate was the result of an increase in the number of employed people by 9,800. Nationally, the unemployment rate in May remained the same as April's 7.3%. Since May 2011, the number of people employed in Alberta has increased by 84,500 or 4.1%, the highest growth rate among the provinces and far outpacing the Canadian growth rate of 1.2%. Sizeable employment gains were noted for mining and oil and gas (up 31,500), retail trade (up 15,300) and construction (up 12,900). In March, the number of Employment Insurance (EI) recipients was 31.0% less than the number for March 2011. Total wages and salaries paid to all Alberta employees in the first quarter of 2012 was 7.7% higher than for the same period in 2011.

Consumer Spending: As compared to March 2011, retail sales increased by 9.0% in March 2012. In the first quarter of 2012, retail sales rose 9.7% from the same period last year. From January to May, the number of Alberta homes sold via the Multiple Listing Service increased by 17.4% compared to the same period in 2011. Between January and April of 2012, the number of new motor vehicles sold rose by 13.0% from the first four months of 2011. In April, Albertans paid 0.8% more for the goods and services that comprise the Consumer Price Index (CPI) than in April 2011. Nationally, the CPI increased by 2.0%.

Construction: In May, Alberta urban housing starts rose by 26.6%, as compared to May 2011. Year-to-date, Alberta urban housing starts rose by 49.4% from the same period in 2011 due mostly to a large increase in multiple starts (up 114.6%). Single starts rose by 9.9% over the same period.

Municipalities in Alberta took out \$1.3 billion in building permits in April, up 48.5% from the same month in 2011. On a year-to-date basis, the value of Alberta's building permits rose 16.7% as compared to the same period in 2011.

Manufacturing: In April, the value of Alberta's manufacturing shipments increased by 7.9% from April 2011 to \$6.3 billion. Large increases were recorded for computers and electronics (up 62.0%), machinery (up 29.6%) and non-metallic mineral products (up 11.7%). On a year-to-date basis, manufacturing shipments rose 12.9% from the same period in 2011.

Farm Cash Receipts: Farm cash receipts increased by 28.3% to \$3.5 billion in the first quarter of 2012 as compared to the same quarter last year. Crop receipts rose 45.8% to \$2.1 billion, with the highest increase recorded for canola (up 67.2%). Livestock receipts rose 13.4%, to \$1.2 billion. The highest increase in livestock receipts was recorded for cattle and calves (up 14.4%). Program payments were down 9.2% over the same period.

Exports: In April, Alberta's merchandise exports increased by 21.2%, compared to April 2011, to \$8.4 billion. On a year-to-date basis, Alberta exports rose by 15.9% from the same period last year. Primary agriculture, mining and energy and manufacturing exports rose by 28.1%, 17.5%, and 8.5% respectively.

Incorporations and Bankruptcies: Over the January to May 2012 period, the number of business incorporations fell by 0.1% from the same period last year. From January to March of 2012, the number of business bankruptcies fell 17.9% and consumer bankruptcies fell by 14.6% as compared to the same period last year.







NEW MOTOR VEHICLE SALES







BUILDING PERMITS





UNEMPLOYMENT RATE ALBERTA REGIONS




5-YEAR POPULATION GROWTH RATE ALBERTA REGIONS


