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Current Economic Indicators August 2013 Highlights

Labour Force: The unemployment rate in Alberta fell from 5.0% in June to 4.5% in July. This was mostly the result of an increase in employment by 16,600. Unemployment fell by 10,900 over the same period. Alberta's unemployment rate was second to Saskatchewan's 4.0% and is well below the national average of 7.2%. Over the past 12 months, the number of people employed increased by 3.0% or by 65,300. This is the second highest growth rate registered by any province and is more than double the national growth rate of 1.3%. The largest employment gains were in professional, scientific and technical services (up 28,200), retail trade (up 16,900) and information, culture and recreation (up 15,100).

Consumer Spending: In May, the value of retail sales rose by 7.9% from May 2012 to \$6.1 billion led by a 14.5% increase in motor and recreational vehicles sales. From January to May 2013, retail trade increased by 6.6% from the same period last year. The number of vehicles sold increased by 3.4% between June 2012 and June 2013. On a year-over-year basis Albertans paid 2.3% more in June for the goods and services that comprise the Consumer Price Index than a year ago.

Construction: Alberta urban housing starts fell by 0.6% in July, compared to the same month in 2012. On a year-to-date basis, urban housing starts rose by 8.2% from the same period in 2012: single-detached starts rose by 6.5% and multiple starts rose by 9.8%. Municipalities in Alberta issued \$1.4 billion in building permits in June, up 24.3% from June 2012. Commercial, industrial and residential permits increased by 21.0%, 14.1% and 10.5%, respectively, while institutional permits more than doubled in value. In the first half of 2013, the value of

Alberta building permits rose 19.2% from the same period last year, to \$8.5 billion.

Energy: In May, production of crude oil fell by 2.6% as compared to the same month in 2012 while natural gas production fell by 1.7%. In July, the number of active drilling rigs fell by 5.6% from July 2012 to 187. The average number of active drilling rigs fell by 9.2% between January and July as compared to January to July of 2012.

Manufacturing: In June, the value of Alberta manufacturing shipments rose 2.7% from June 2012, to \$6.1 billion. The largest increases were registered by chemicals and chemical products (up 35.4%) and petroleum and coal products (up 24.8%). On a year-to-date basis, Alberta manufacturing shipments fell by 1.4% from the same period in 2012.

Exports: In June, the value of international merchandise exports fell by 0.5%, compared to June 2012, to \$7.7 billion. Mining and energy exports rose 2.0%, while exports of primary agriculture and manufacturing goods fell by 18.2% and 3.5%, respectively. Between the first half of 2012 and the first half of 2013, Alberta exports increased by 2.1% to \$49.7 billion as manufacturing, mining and energy and primary agriculture exports rose 2.7%, 2.2% and 1.3%, respectively.

Bankruptcies and Incorporations: In May, the number of business bankruptcies was down 60.7% from May 2012 and consumer bankruptcies fell by 15.7% over the same period. The number of business incorporations increased by 14.9% between July 2012 and July 2013 to 3,468. Between January and July of 2013, business incorporations remained unchanged from a year ago.

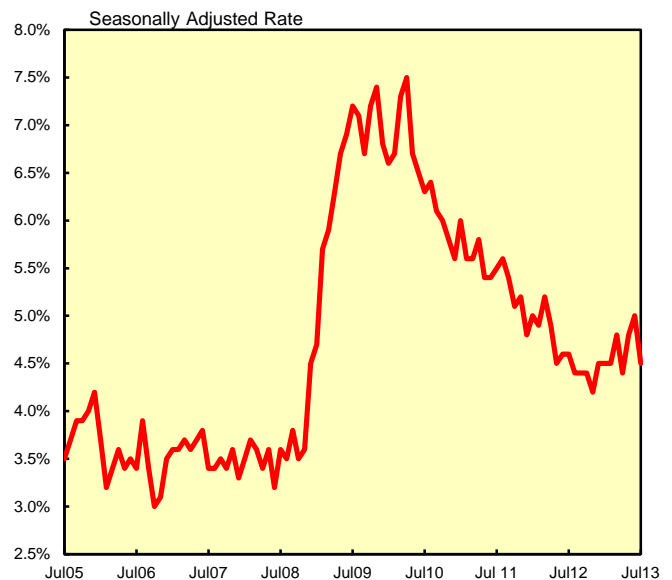

NEW MOTOR VEHICLE SALES



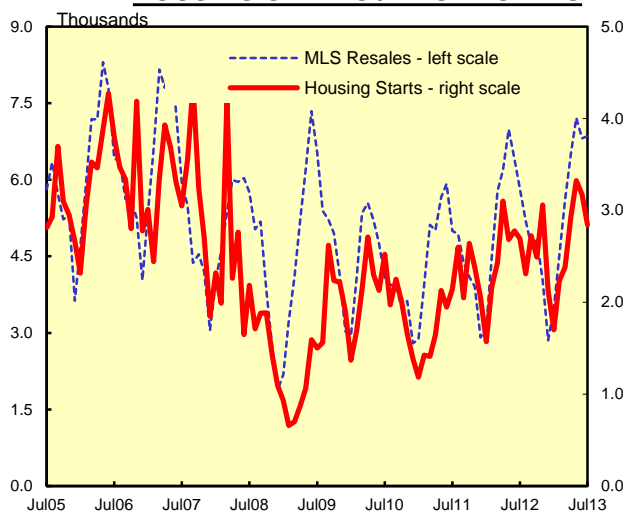

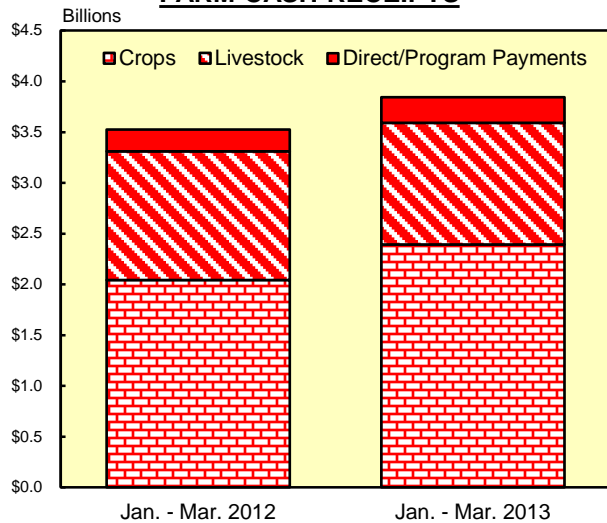

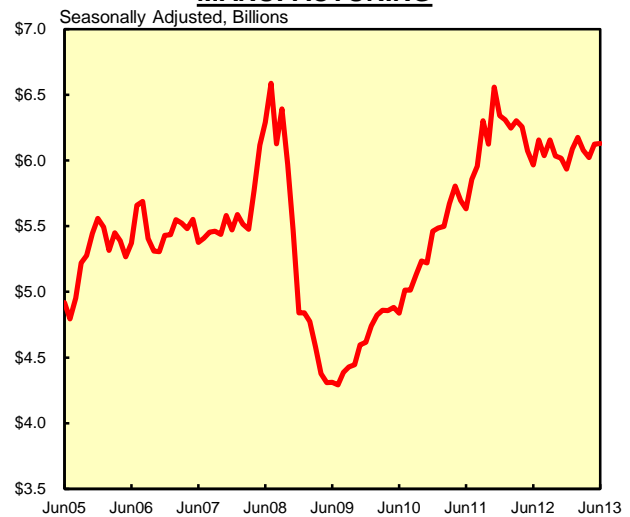
