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## Current Economic Indicators May 2013 Highlights

**Labour Force:** In April, Alberta's unemployment rate was 4.4%, down from March's 4.8%. The fall in April's unemployment rate was the result of an increase in employment of 14,800 as well as a decrease in unemployment of 10,200. The Canadian unemployment rate in April remained unchanged at 7.2%. On a year-over-year basis, the number of people employed in Alberta was 40,100 higher than in April 2012. Significant employment gains were registered in the following industries: professional, scientific and technical services (up 23,800); health care and social assistance (up 13,300); and wholesale (up 12,600). The number of Employment Insurance recipients was 27,920 in March, 9.7% less than the number registered in March 2012.

**Consumer Spending:** In March, retail sales in Alberta were \$5.9 billion, up 4.7% from the same month in 2012. On a year-to-date basis, retail sales rose 5.5% from the same period of last year. The number of new motor vehicles fell 0.1% in March of this year, compared to March 2012. In March 2013, the number of Alberta homes sold via the Multiple Listing Service increased by 5.0%, as compared to the same month in 2012, to 6,501. On a year-over-year basis, Albertans paid 1.3% more in April for the goods and services that comprise the Consumer Price Index than a year ago.

**Construction:** In April 2013, housing starts fell by 5.6% as compared to a year ago. For the January to April period, urban housing starts rose by 1.4% from the same period last year to 9,397 as a result of a 10.4% rise in single detached starts. Multiple starts fell by 6.1% over the same period. The value of building permits increased by 38.2% in March 2013, compared to a year ago. In the first quarter of 2013, the value of building permits was 28.0% higher than it was in the same quarter of last year. Institutional and government permits more than tripled in value from the same period in 2012. Commercial and residential permits rose by 21.1% and 13.9%, respectively, while industrial permits fell by 4.6%. Nationally, the value of building permits fell by 6.6% over the same period.

**Farm Cash Receipts:** Farm cash receipts increased by 9.3% to \$3.8 billion in the first quarter of 2013 as compared to the same quarter last year. Crop receipts rose 17.3% to \$2.4 billion, with the highest increase recorded for durum wheat (up 66.5%). Livestock receipts fell 4.8% to \$1.2 billion led by a 10% fall in hog receipts. In 2012, Alberta farm receipts reached a record \$12 billion, an increase of 14.1% from 2011. Crop and livestock receipts rose 22.4% and 5.1%, respectively, in 2012.

**Manufacturing:** The value of Alberta manufacturing shipments fell by 2.0% between March 2012 and March 2013 to \$6.2 billion. In the first quarter of 2013, Alberta manufacturing shipments decreased by 1.8%, due mostly to falls in machinery (down 15.2%) and metal fabrication (down 8.2%). Alberta's wood products sector rose 41.6% in the first quarter of 2013 because of the recovery in the US housing market.

**Energy:** In February 2013, the production volumes of crude oil increased by 7.6% from February 2012, while the production of natural gas fell 1.3% over the same period. The number of active drilling rigs in April 2013 was 88, the same number as in April 2012. On a year-to-date basis, drilling activity was down 6.2% from the same period in 2012.

**Exports:** In April 2013, the value of Alberta's merchandise exports rose 1.4% from March 2012 to \$8.4 billion. Manufacturing, primary agriculture and mining and energy exports rose 4.7%, 2.2% and 0.4%, respectively. Between January and April of 2013, the value of exports rose 1.5%, compared to the same period last year: primary agricultural exports rose 3.2%, manufacturing 2.4% and mining and energy 1.2%.

**Bankruptcies and Incorporations:** In February 2013, the number of business bankruptcies fell by 50% and the number of consumer bankruptcies by 22.7%, compared to the same month in 2012. In April 2013, the number of businesses incorporated in Alberta was 7.2% higher than in the same month of 2012.

### NEW MOTOR VEHICLE SALES





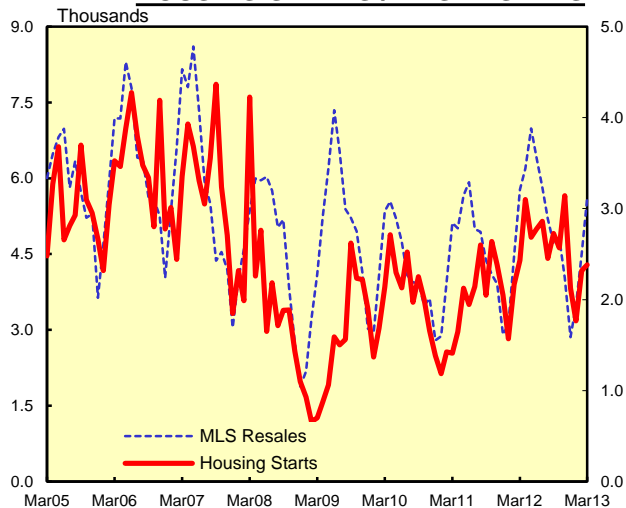

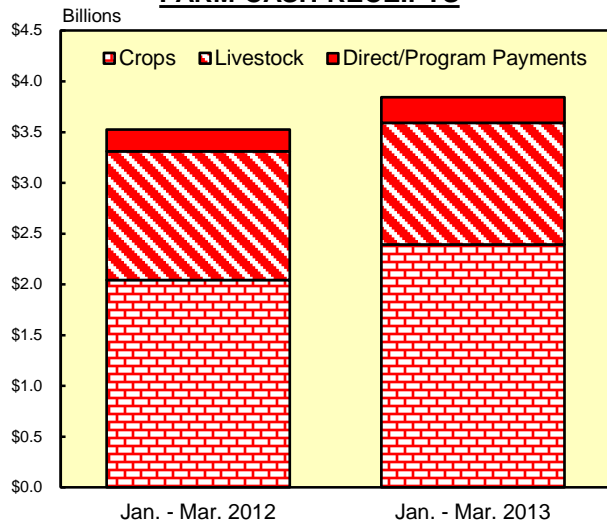

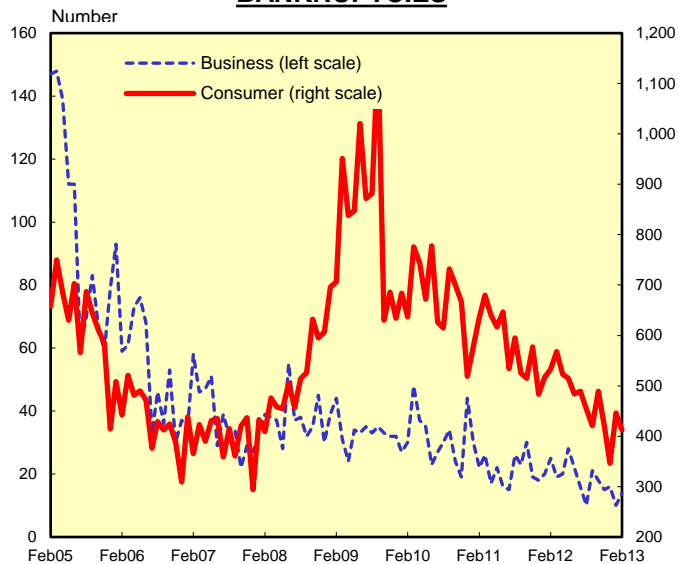
