Current Economic Indicators

Highlights

Labour Force: In April, Alberta's unemployment rate was 4.9%, down from March's 5.3%. The fall in April's unemployment rate was the result of an increase in employment of 10,700 as well as a decrease in unemployment of 6,600. The Canadian unemployment rate in April rose 0.1 percentage points to 7.3% as more people joined the labour force. On a year-over-year basis, the number of people employed in Alberta was 79,900 higher in April 2012. Significant employment gains were registered in the following industries: mining and oil and gas (up 32,500); retail trade (up 31,400); and construction (up 18,800). The following industries registered significant job losses: wholesale trade (down 20,400); and professional scientific and technical services (down 9,000). The number of Employment Insurance recipients was 27,880 in February, 33.9% less than the number registered in February 2011.

Consumer Spending: In February, retail sales in Alberta were \$5.6 billion, up 9.1% from the same month in 2011. On a year-to-date basis, retail sales rose by 10.0% from the same period last year. The number of new motor vehicles rose 12.9% to 22,061 in March of this year, compared to March 2011. In March 2012, the number of Alberta homes sold via the Multiple Listing Service increased by 23.5% to 6,191 as compared to the same month in 2011. On a year-over-year basis, Albertans paid 1.7% more in March for the goods and services that comprise the Consumer Price Index as compared to a year ago.

Construction: In April 2012, housing starts rose by 78.1% as compared to a year ago. For the January to April period, urban housing starts rose by 60.6% from the same period last year to 9,102 as a result of a 126.4% rise in multiple starts and an 18.3% rise in single unit starts. The value of building permits increased by 37.5% in March 2012, compared to a year ago. In the first quarter of 2012, the value of building permits was 7.5% higher than it was in the same quarter of last year. Commercial, residential, and institutional permits rose by 34.6%, 34.5% and

31.1%, respectively, while industrial permits fell by 63.1%. Nationally, the value of building permits rose by 7.6% over the same period.

Manufacturing: The value of Alberta manufacturing shipments rose by 13.0% between March 2011 and March 2012 to \$6.4 billion. In the first quarter of 2012, Alberta manufacturing shipments increased by 14.6%, led by strong growth for computers and electronics (up 52.1%), machinery (up 41.8%) and metal fabricating (up 36.1%).

Energy: In February 2012, the production volumes of crude oil increased by 10.1% from February 2011, while the production of natural gas fell 6.1% over the same period. The number of active drilling rigs in April rose 14.6% to 141 rigs from April 2011. On a year-to-date basis, drilling activity was up 4.7% from the same period in 2011.

Exports: In March 2012, the value of Alberta's merchandise exports rose by 11.1% from March 2011 to \$8.8 billion. Primary agriculture, mining and energy exports and manufacturing exports increased by 31.2%, 11.2% and 6.4%, respectively. In the first quarter of 2012, the value of exports rose by 14.5%, compared to the same period last year: primary agriculture rose 28.9%, mining and energy exports rose 14.5%, and manufacturing exports rose 11.1%. Nationally, exports rose 8.1% over the same period.

Bankruptcies and Incorporations: In December 2011, the number of business bankruptcies fell by 59.1% and the number of consumer bankruptcies by 6.9%, compared to the same period in 2010. In the year 2011, business bankruptcies were 30.2% lower than in 2010 while consumer bankruptcies were 13.8% lower over the same period. In April 2012, the number of businesses incorporated in Alberta was 23.9% higher than in the same month of 2011. On a year-to-date basis, business incorporations were 3.0% lower than over the same period in 2011.







NEW MOTOR VEHICLE SALES







BUILDING PERMITS







January - March 2012






