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## Current Economic Indicators April 2012 Highlights

**Labour Force:** In March 2012, Alberta's unemployment rate increased to 5.3% from February's 5.0% as the increase in the labour force far outpaced the growth in employment. Canada's unemployment rate in March was 7.2%. As compared to March 2011, the number of people employed in Alberta increased by 64,900 or 3.1%, well above the national growth rate of 1.1%. Significant employment gains were registered in the following industries: mining, oil and gas extraction (up 24,400), retail trade (up 21,800), and construction (up 21,300). The largest losses were registered for manufacturing (down 18,800), wholesale trade (down 16,300) and professional, scientific and technical services (down 4,400). The number of employment insurance recipients decreased by 33.3% to 29,410 in January, as compared to the same month in 2011.

**Consumer Spending:** In January, the value of retail sales increased 9.4%, as compared to the same month in 2011. All industries other than the food and beverage industry registered significant gains. The largest increases were registered for motor and recreational vehicle sales (up 24.5%), and clothing and accessories and building and outdoor home supplies (both up by 11%).

**Construction:** Between March 2011 and March 2012, housing starts rose by 72.4% to 2,433, as a result of an 87.1% rise in multiple starts and a 54.7% rise in single starts. In the first quarter of 2012, housing starts were 53.4% higher than in the same quarter in 2011. On a national basis, urban housing starts were up 19.6% over the same period. In February, the value of building permits decreased by 22.7% from the same month in 2011 mostly as a result of a 85.5% fall in industrial permits and a 13.8% fall in commercial permits. Institutional and residential permits rose

by 114.5% and 61.5%, respectively, over the same period.

**Manufacturing:** In February, the value of Alberta manufacturing shipments increased by 18.4% as compared to February 2011 to \$6.5 billion. The largest gains in the value of shipments were recorded for computer and electronic shipments (up 50.5%), non-metallic mineral products shipments (up 37.3%) and machinery (up 34.6%). Year-to-date, a 17.5% increase in the value of shipments was recorded as compared to January to February of 2011. Nationally, a 5.3% increase was noted in manufacturing shipments over the same period.

**Energy:** Between January 2011 and January 2012, production of natural gas fell by 11.4% while crude oil production rose by 8.8% from a year earlier. In March, the number of active drilling rigs was down 7.7% as compared to the same month in 2011. In the first quarter of 2011, the number of active drilling rigs was 3.7% higher than in the same period last year.

**Exports:** The value of Alberta's international merchandise exports increased by 16.7% in February as compared to the same month in 2011, to \$8.0 billion. On a year-to-date basis, exports rose 15.0% from the same period in 2011, as primary agriculture, mining and energy, and manufacturing exports increased by 27.6%, 14.5% and 13.9%, respectively. Canadian exports rose by 9.8% over the same period.

**Incorporations:** In March 2012, the number of business incorporations fell by 28.0% from March 2011 to 3,912. In the first quarter of 2012 incorporations were down 9.3% as compared to the same month in 2011.

### NEW MOTOR VEHICLE SALES





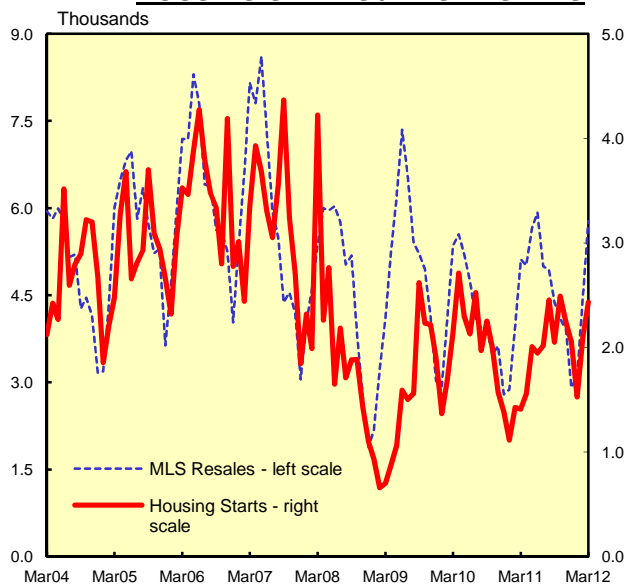
