## Current Economic Indicators

March 2012

### Highlights

**Labour Force:** Alberta's unemployment rate was 5.0% in February, up from 4.9% in January as the size of the labour force shrank by 7,000 and the number of people employed fell by 7,200. At 5.0%, Alberta's unemployment rate is tied with Saskatchewan as the lowest provincial unemployment rates in the country. Since February 2011, employment has risen by 58,400 or 2.8%, which is the highest employment growth rate in the country. Nationally, employment grew by 0.7% over the same period. The largest employment gains were in retail trade (up 28,000), mining, oil and gas extraction (up 24,700), and construction (up 15,800). In December 2011, the number of employment insurance recipients fell by 36.3% from December 2010 to 29,370. Total wages and salaries paid to all Alberta employees in 2011 increased by 8.4% from 2010.

**Consumer Spending:** In December 2011, Alberta's retail sales increased by 7.1%, compared to a year earlier. In the year 2011, sales by retailers rose by 7.0% to \$64.0 billion from 2010, the second largest increase of all provinces. The number of homes sold in Alberta via the Multiple Listing Service increased by 13.5% in February, compared to the same month of 2011. In January, new motor vehicle sales rose by 23.2% from January 2011. Between January 2011 and January 2012, Alberta's Consumer Price Index (CPI) rose 2.9%. Over the same period, Canada's CPI increased by 2.3%.

**Construction:** In February 2012, Alberta urban housing starts increased by 47.6%, compared to February 2011, mainly as a result of a 150.0% increase in multiple starts. Single starts increased by 1.2% over the same period. In January 2012, the value of building permits increased by 27.9% from the same month in 2011: institutional, commercial, residential and industrial permits rose by 166.1%, 50.6%, 31.3% and 22.1% respectively.

**Manufacturing:** In January, the value of Alberta's manufacturing shipments increased by 16.5% from January 2011 to \$6.4 billion. Increased were registered in all industries led by computers and electronics (up 34.4%) metal

fabrication (up 33.5%) and machinery (up 30.4%). Between 2010 and 2011, manufacturing shipments rose 18.1% to \$70.9 billion. The largest increases were registered for machinery (up 33.0%), petroleum and coal products (up 28.1%) and metal fabrication (up 22.6%). Nationally, manufacturing shipments rose by 5.0% in 2011.

**Farm Cash Receipts:** Farm cash receipts rose by 16.2% to \$10.5 billion in 2011 as compared to 2010, due mostly to a 35.2% rise in crop receipts; livestock receipts rose 5.5%. In the last quarter of 2011, farm cash receipts were up 22.3% from the same quarter in 2010 (crop and receipts rose 28.4%, and 21.4% respectively).

**Energy:** In February, the number of active drilling rigs rose by 9.9%, compared to the same month of 2011, to 459 rigs. On a year-to-date basis, the average number of drilling rigs rose by 8.9% from the same period in 2011. Between 2010 and 2011, crude oil production rose by 7.0% to 130 million m<sup>3</sup> while natural gas production fell by 4.3% to 133 billion m<sup>3</sup>.

**Exports:** In January, the value of Alberta's merchandise exports increased by 12.6% from January 2011 to \$8.4 billion. Primary agriculture, manufacturing and mining and energy exports rose 32.5%, 13.9% and 11.1%, respectively.

**Incorporations:** In February, the number of business incorporations increased by 6.0% to 3,391 from February 2011. On a year-to-date basis, business incorporations rose by 5.6% from the same period in 2011.

**Population:** As of January 1, 2012, Alberta's population was 3,817,980, an increase of 2.0% from January 1, 2011, the highest provincial growth rate in the country. By comparison, Canada's population grew by 1.1% over the same period. In 2011, most of Alberta's population increase was the result of a total of 19,141 for net interprovincial migration (more than four times the number recorded in 2010) and a total of 25,898 for net international migration (10,901 more than what was recorded in 2010).

### NEW MOTOR VEHICLE SALES





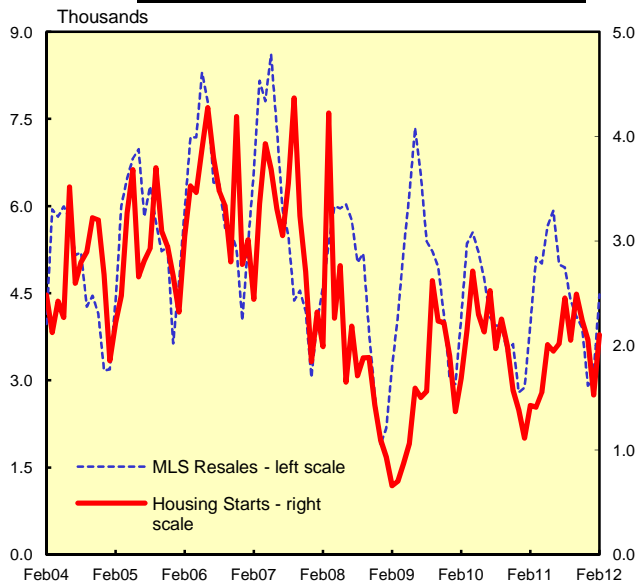

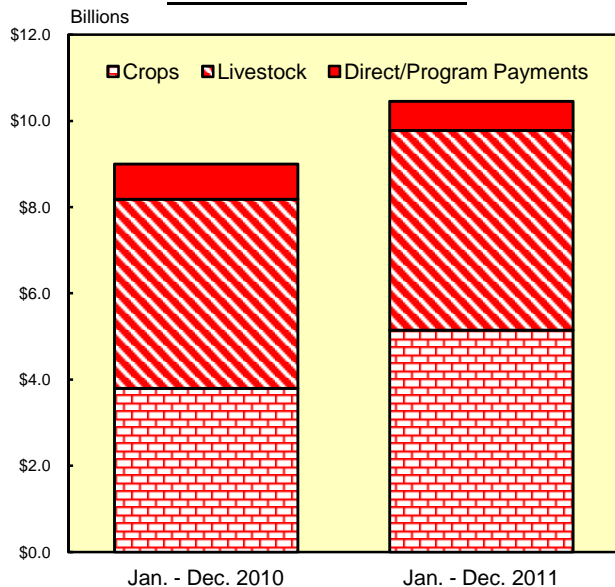

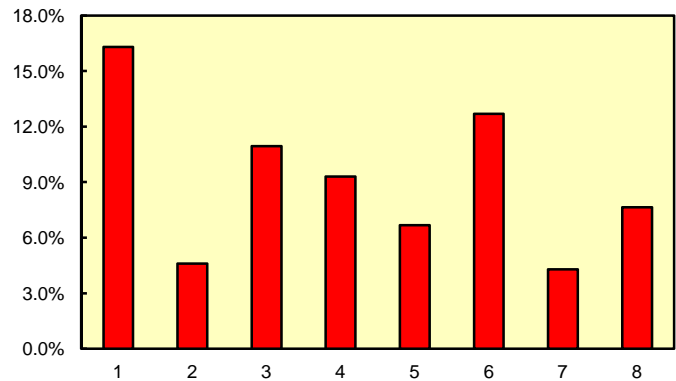

## UNEMPLOYMENT RATE ALBERTA REGIONS



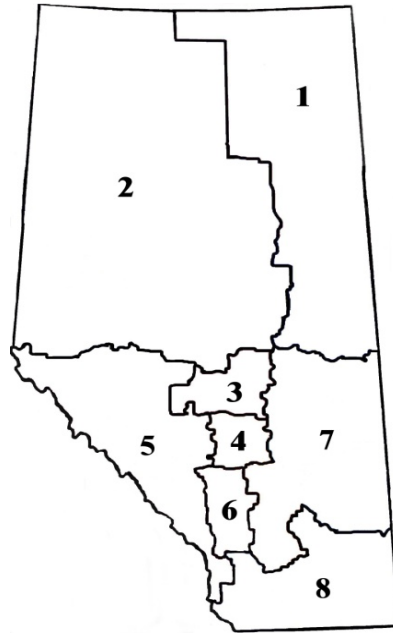
## 5-YEAR POPULATION GROWTH RATE ALBERTA REGIONS

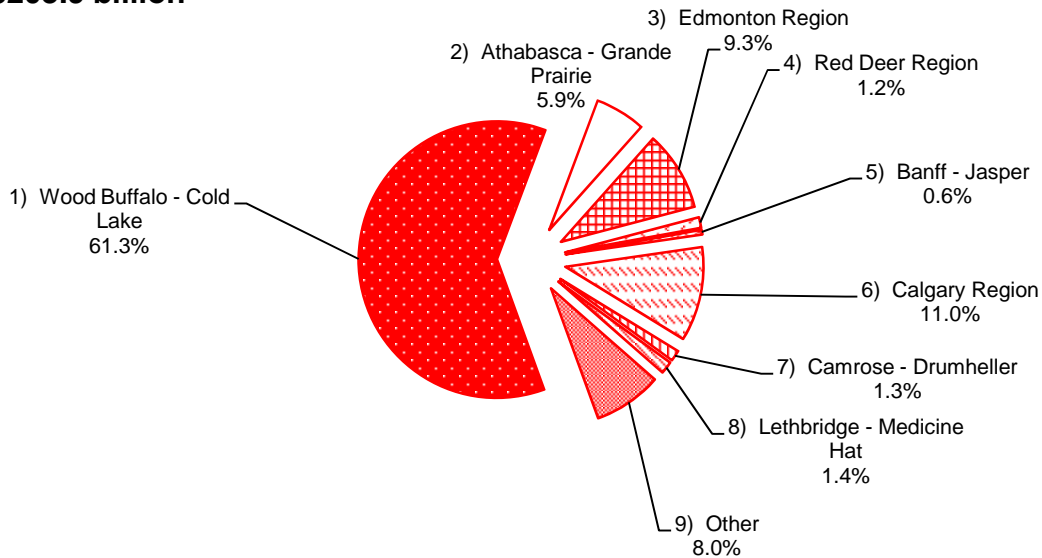
