

Labour Force Statistics

November 2014

Alberta Highlights:

- Alberta's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.4% in November 2014, unchanged from October 2014 and down by 0.4 percentage points from the same month last year. This rate was second lowest in Canada, behind Saskatchewan's 3.4%. The national rate was 6.7%, up 0.1 percentage points from the previous month.
- The unemployment rate remained unchanged from the previous month because the labour force increased by 1,000 people and employment increased by 800. Full-time employment increased by 2,400 and part-time employment decreased by 1,600 over the same period.
- Between November 2013 and November 2014, employment increased by 48,000. This employment increase is even higher than Canada's employment growth, 26,300.
- Employment increased by 3,400 among women aged 25 and over and decreased by 1,500 among their male counterparts from October 2014.
- The following industries had the most employment increases in November 2014 from the previous month: Transportation and Warehousing, 4,100; Health Care and Social Assistance, 3,300; and Agriculture, 3,200.
