

Alberta Economy

Indicators at a Glance

NEW: Economic Activity

The Alberta Activity Index (AAX) was up 4.4% year-over-year (y/y) in January, due mainly to increased business activity. Alberta's real GDP by expenditure fell by 3.7% in 2016, the largest drop among the provinces for the second year in a row.

Population

Alberta's population was 4,318,772 as of January 1, 2018, an increase of 1.4% from the year prior. Canada's population grew 1.3% from a year ago.

Migration

Net migration to Alberta was 5,599 in the fourth quarter of 2017. During this time, Alberta welcomed 5,297 net international migrants, while there was a net inflow of interprovincial migrants (+302) for the second consecutive quarter after in eight quarters of outflows.

Employment¹

The economy added 2,300 jobs in February, as gains in part-time positions more than offset a decline in full-time positions. Employment rose 2.0% y/y, reflecting employment gains in both the goods (+4.8% y/y) and services (+1.0% y/y) sectors.

Unemployment Rate¹

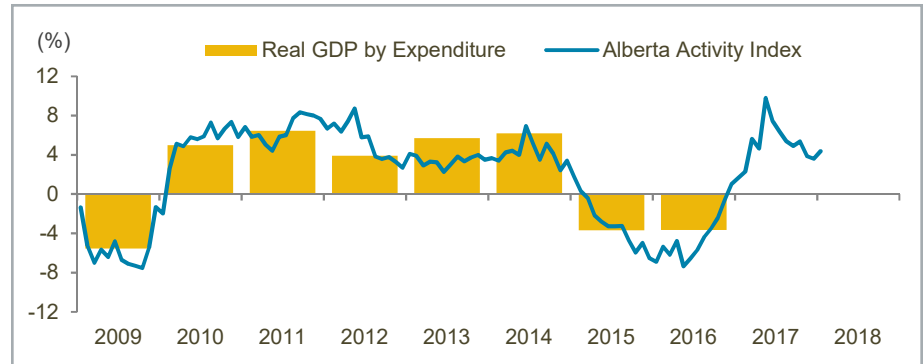
Alberta's unemployment rate fell by 0.3 percentage point to 6.7% in February. Canada's unemployment rate ticked down 0.1 percentage point to 5.8%.

Rigs Drilling

The number of active rigs in Alberta averaged 216 in February, up 15% y/y. The average rig utilization rate was 52%, up from 43% a year ago.

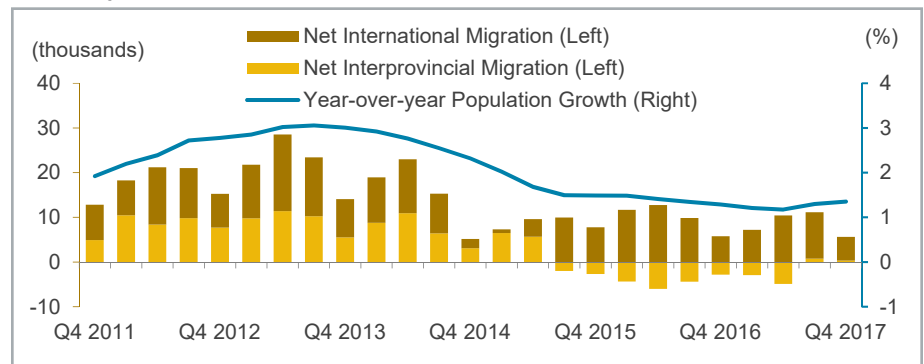
Year-over-year % change

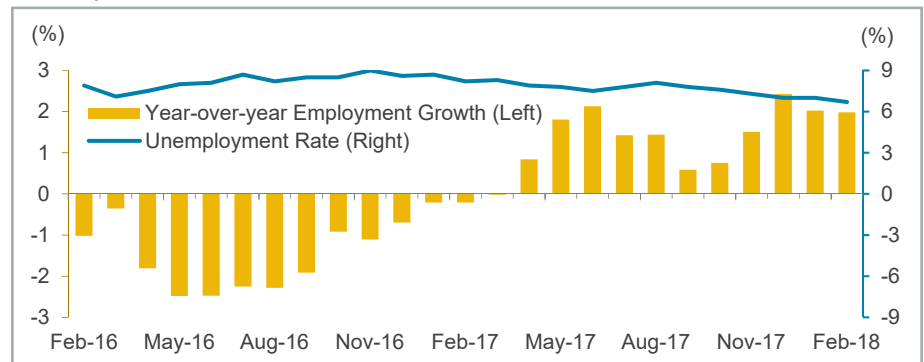

Inflation

The annual Inflation rate in Alberta jumped by 0.8 percentage points to 2.2% y/y in February. Inflation excluding food and energy prices was up 0.4 percentage points to 1.4% y/y.

NEW: Average Weekly Earnings¹

Average weekly earnings (AWE) in Alberta ticked down by 0.1% m/m in January to \$1,147. Earnings increased 3.1% y/y driven by increased earnings in both the goods and services sectors.

Retail Sales¹

Alberta retail sales rose 0.5% m/m to \$6.8 billion in January. Retail sales are up 2.1% y/y, the fourteenth consecutive month of year-over-year gains.

Housing Starts¹

Alberta housing starts fell by 3.5% m/m in February to 24,301 units (annualized). They were down 8.5% y/y, with declines in both multi-family (-14% y/y) and single-family starts (-7.2% y/y).

New Housing Price Index

In January, Alberta's New Housing Price Index (NHPI) ticked up by 0.1% y/y. The house-only component was unchanged, while land prices were up (+0.4% y/y).

Building Permits¹

Alberta building permits eased by 13% y/y in January to \$1.1 billion, as increased residential permits (+5.3% y/y) was more than offset by a decline in non-residential permits (-33% y/y).

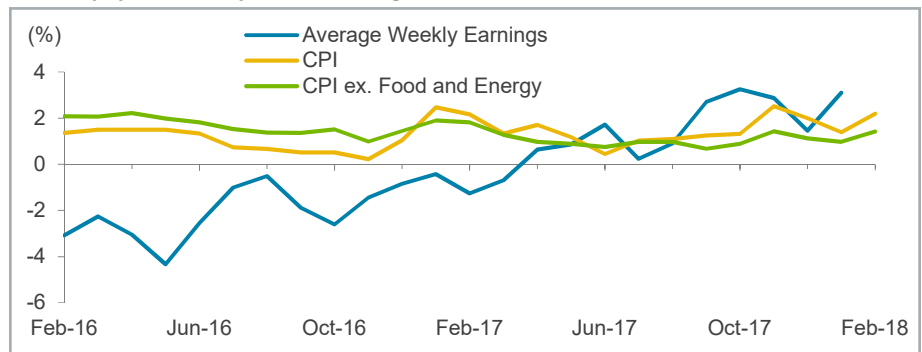

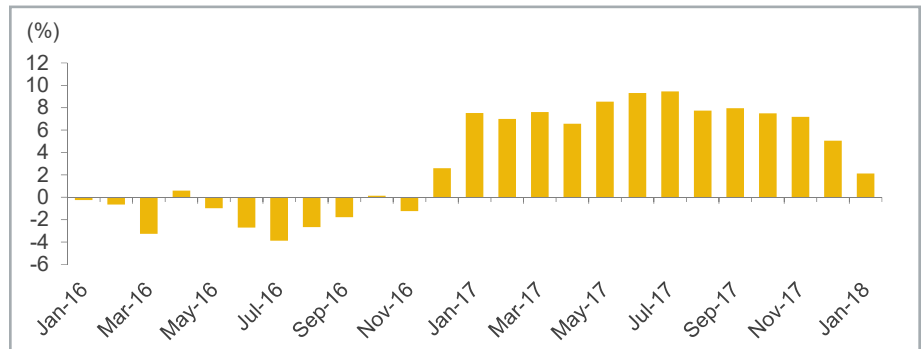
Monthly, year-over-year % change

Retail Sales

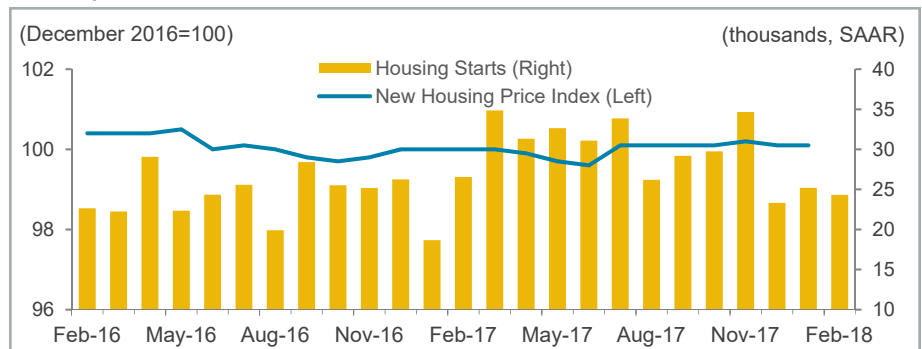
Monthly, year-over-year % change

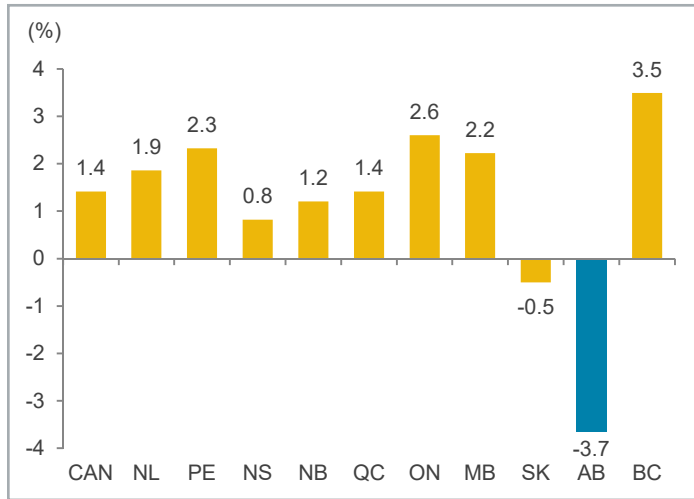

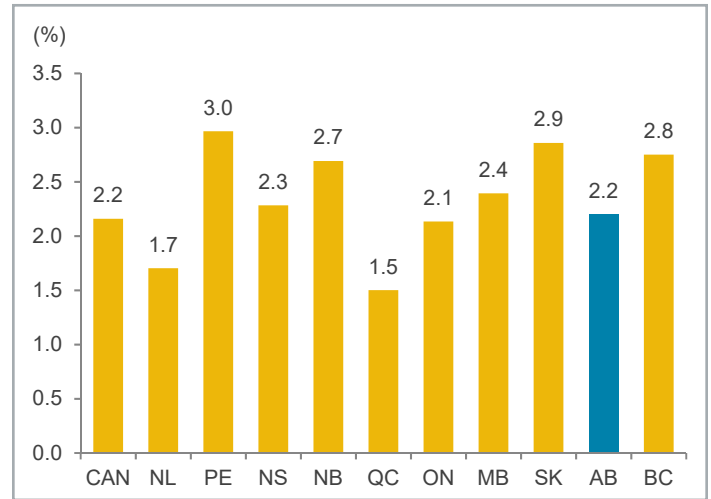

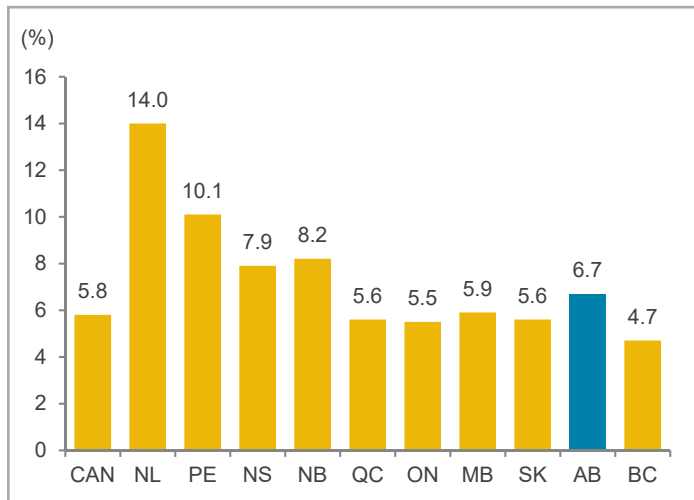
Real GDP by Expenditure
(2016, year-over-year growth)



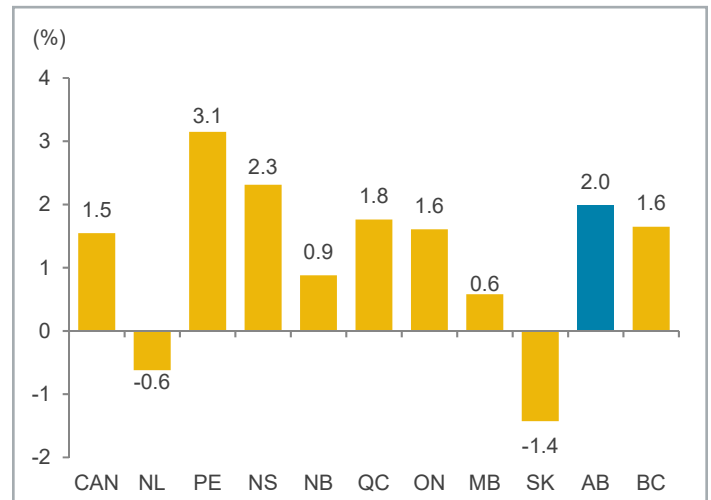
CPI Inflation
(February 2018, year-over-year growth)



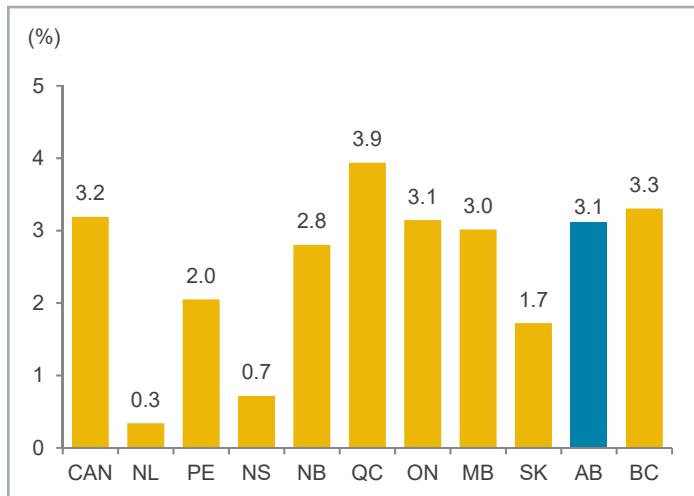
Unemployment Rate
(February 2018)



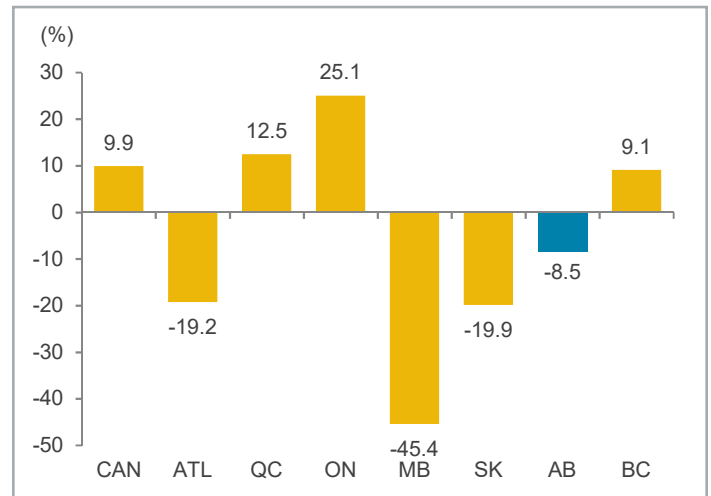
Employment
