Minister Shannon Phillips Mission to Minneapolis, Minnesota December 6 to 8, 2017



Overview:

Minister Shannon Phillips led a mission to Minneapolis, Minnesota from December 6 to 8, 2017 where she promoted Alberta's investment opportunities, discussed the province's strong regulatory framework, pipeline safety, and shared the achievements of Alberta's Climate Leadership Plan.

The mission was successful in meeting its objectives, as outlined below.

Mission Objectives:

- Sharing the success of Alberta's Climate Leadership Plan since 2015.
- Promoting the investment opportunities that the Climate Leadership Plan is creating, and the attractiveness of Alberta as an investment destination.
- Strengthening the relationships that Alberta enjoys with Minnesota partners.
- Meeting with industry and union representatives to share information and learn more about local issues related to Alberta.
- Finding out more about Minnesota's near and long-term ambitions on climate change and economic development.

Results:

- Minister Phillips attended the Jobs for Minnesota dinner, where she met with industry and union representatives to share information about Alberta's Climate Leadership Plan and learn more about local issues related to Alberta.
- Minister Phillips met with John Linc Stine, Commissioner of the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency, to share progress on the Climate Leadership Plan and discuss Minnesota's approach to climate change.
- Minister Phillips met with Jessica Looman, Commissioner of the Minnesota Department of Commerce, to discuss Alberta's view that Alberta oil is the best regulated and most responsibly-produced energy available to Minnesota.
- Minister Phillips met with Kate Knuth, City of Minneapolis Chief Resiliency Officer.
- The University of Minnesota Institute on Environment hosted "Alberta's Climate Leadership Plan: A conversation with Minister Shannon Phillips," where Minister Phillips spoke about Alberta's Climate Leadership Plan and the steps the Alberta government is taking to drive innovation and reduce the environmental footprint of energy production. Following her presentation, the minister participated in a panel discussion on energy policy with J. Drake Hamilton of Fresh Energy and Steve MacDonald of Emissions Reduction Alberta, moderated by Steve Kelley of the University of Minnesota.
- Minister Phillips met with Minnesota State Representative Rick Hansen, Minority Lead, House Environment and Natural Resources Committee.

- Minister Phillips met with Paul Connors, Canada's Acting Consul General to Minneapolis, to discuss local political dynamics and broader Canada-US issues.
- Minister Phillips participated in a media interview with Matthew Lambert of AgriNews on Alberta's Climate Leadership Plan, what farmers have to say about renewable energy, and what steps Canada is taking toward renewable energy.
- Minister Phillips participated in a media interview with Frank Jossi of Midwest Energy News to discuss Canada's leadership in environmental management, sustainable energy and clean technology.
- Minister Phillips participated in a media interview with Tom Weber of Minnesota Public Radio where she discussed Alberta's climate leadership, Indigenous engagement and energy partnerships.
