


## Highlights: Alberta Indigenous Peoples living off reserve

 The unadjusted three-month moving average unemployment rate for Indigenous Peoples living off reserve in Alberta was 6.6% in January 2023. This is down 0.2 percentage points from December 2022 and down 5.1 percentage points from the same month last year. The national rate was 7.3%, unchanged from the month before.

- The unemployment rate decreased because the labour force decreased by 900 and employment decreased by 400 from December 2022 to January 2023.
- In January 2023, there were 139,700 employed Indigenous Peoples living off reserve. This represents 5.9% of Alberta's overall employment. Of those employed, 113,700 were employed full-time and 25,900 were employed part-time.
- In the Edmonton Economic Region, there were 51,200 Indigenous Peoples employed, and in the Calgary Economic Region, 28,800 were employed. In the rest of Alberta, 59,700 Indigenous Peoples were employed in January 2023.

- The three occupations that employed the greatest number of Indigenous Peoples in January 2023 were: sales and service occupations (36,200); trades, transport and equipment operators and related occupations (32,000); and business, finance and administration occupations (24,900).
- Between December 2022 and January 2023, the industries with the most employment increases were: educational services (+1,400); forestry, fishing, mining, oil and gas (+600); and finance, insurance, real estate and leasing (+500).
