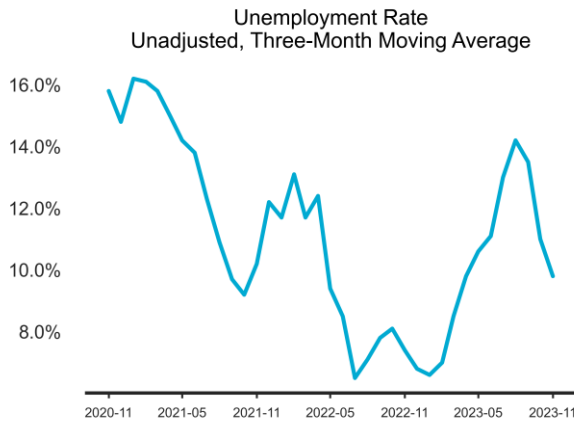


# Labour Force Statistics

## November 2023

### Highlights: Alberta Indigenous Peoples living off reserve

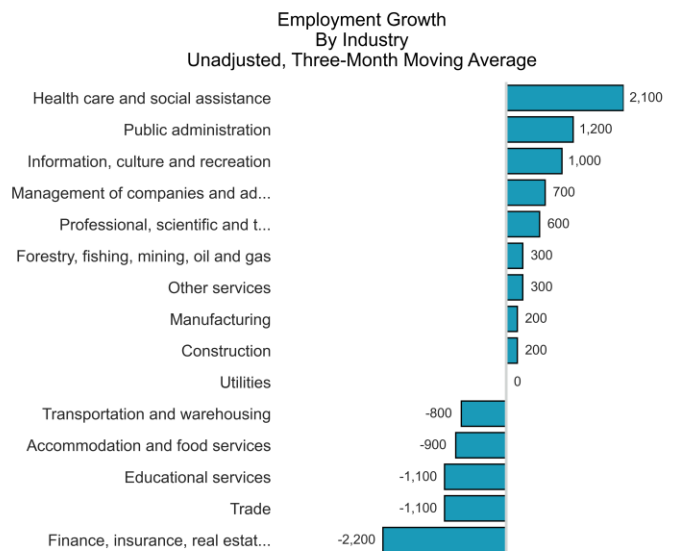
- The unadjusted three-month moving average unemployment rate for Indigenous Peoples living off reserve in Alberta was 9.8 per cent in November 2023. This is down 1.2 percentage points from October 2023 and up 2.4 percentage points from the same month last year. The national rate was 8.6 per cent, a decrease of 0.7 percentage points from the month before.

- The unemployment rate decreased as the labour force increased by 500 and employment increased by 2,200 from October 2023 to November 2023.
- In November 2023, the unemployment rates for First Nations and Métis people were 13.5 per cent and 7.5 per cent, respectively.
- In November 2023, there were 132,100 employed Indigenous Peoples living off reserve. This represents 5.3 per cent of Alberta's overall employment. Of those employed, 106,100 were employed full-time and 26,000 were employed part-time.
- Of the 132,100 employed Indigenous Peoples living off reserve, 84,700 worked in the private sector, 32,700 in the public sector and 14,700 were self-employed.

- In November 2023, 54.1 per cent of employment for Indigenous Peoples in the province was in the Edmonton (42,800) and Calgary (28,700) economic regions. There were 60,600 employed Indigenous Peoples in the rest of Alberta.
- Employment increased for females aged 25 to 54 years (+1,000), males aged 25 to 54 years (+2,600) and males aged 55+ years (+1,400). Employment shrunk for females aged 15 to 24 years (-900), females aged 55+ years (-100) and males aged 15 to 24 years (-1,800).
- The three occupations that employed the greatest number of Indigenous Peoples in November 2023 were: sales and service occupations, except management (32,200); trades, transport and equipment operators and related occupations, except management (27,500); and occupations in education, law and social, community and government services, except management (14,800).
- Between October 2023 and November 2023, the industries with the most employment increases were: health care and social assistance; public administration; and information, culture and recreation.
