 Graze horses away from wetlands and soft ground.

 Keep toiletry products, food and garbage in sealed containers

Keep pets on a leash

Carry bear spray



CAREFUL WITH YOUR CAMPFIRE

- Keep fires small and never leave them unattended
- When you leave, soak the fire, stir it and soak it again.

REPORT VANDALISM

CHECKLIST

- □ Camp well away from shorelines
- Camp on surfaces that are resistant to impact
- Avoid well sites and other industrial infrastructure
- □ Stay away from animal trails and berry patches
- □ Use weed-free feed for horses

Alberta's Public Lands

It's the LAW

- Keep your campsite clean.
- Take all garbage home; leave nothing behind.
- Limit camping stay to 14 days.
- Ensure your camping facilities are temporary and portable.
- Do not cut, chop or clear forest growth.
- Do not deposit harmful materials into watercourses.
- Keep wheels out of water.
