**Overview:**

The [Other Services industry](#)<sup>1</sup> in Alberta includes establishments and services such as:

- automotive repair and maintenance;
- electronic and precision equipment repair and maintenance;
- commercial and industrial machinery and equipment repair and maintenance;
- personal and household goods repair and maintenance;
- personal care services (i.e. hair care and esthetic services);
- funeral services;
- pet care, photofinishing and other personal services;
- religious organizations and grant-making and giving services;
- social advocacy organizations;
- civic and social organizations; and
- business, professional, labour and other membership organizations and private households.

### 1. 2009 Employment and Unemployment Numbers and Rates:

### 2. Industry Growth:

- Employment in the Other Services industry grew by 9.8% in 2009 alone, far exceeding its projected average annual growth rate of 2.1%.
- Employment is expected to exceed its projected level of 101,400 by 2013.

## Trends and Outlook

According to Statistics Canada's National Economic Accounts, the Other Services industry accounted for 2.8% of Alberta's Gross Domestic Product in 2009, up from 2.0% in 1999. Its share of Alberta's total employment increased from 4.8% in 1999 to 5.0% in 2009.

Employment in 2009 was 9.8% higher than it was in 2008. Over the last ten years, employment has increased from 74,500 people in 1999 to 100,100 people in 2009.

The *Alberta Occupational Demand Outlook 2009-2013* projects labour demand growth in most occupations in the industry, including Automotive service technicians and Upholsterers, tailors, shoe repairers, jewellers and related occupations.

Note: Statistics Canada's survey methodology for determining establishment size differs from the one it uses in the Labour Force Survey to determine total employment. As a result, the total number of employees by establishment size will not be the same as total employment in the industry, except by coincidence.

### 2. Demographics: Age and Gender:

According to the Labour Force Survey, the gender breakdown in the Other Services industry is as follows:

- women employed: 47,300 people, or 47.3%
- men employed: 52,800 people, or 52.7%

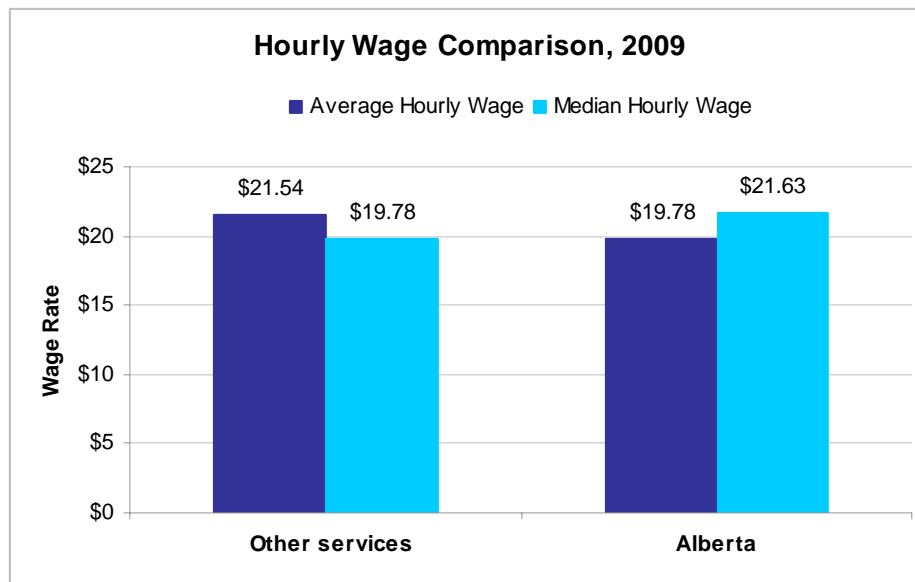
In Alberta, women accounted for 45.4% and men made up 54.6% of total employment.
