

CIRCUMSTANCES UNDER WHICH DEATH OCCURRED

The deceased, [REDACTED] was resident at the Calgary Young Offenders' Centre as a result of having been charged with certain criminal offences.

He was interviewed and assessed by an intake worker, a staff nurse and a staff psychologist. [REDACTED] was interviewed again by the psychologist when he had anger management problems arising from an altercation during a sporting event.

Those dealing with [REDACTED] specifically addressed the question of suicide. Indeed it is evident from the evidence, that the issue of suicide is one which is addressed with respect to each person in CYOC.

Having considered the matter, the conclusion of those involved, and arrived at independently by each of them, was that suicide was not a concern with respect to [REDACTED]

That had also been the conclusion of the Woods Group Home staff psychologist. Unfortunately, for reasons we will never know, [REDACTED] chose to end his life and on August 29, 1991 hanged himself using a bed sheet suspended on a closet door. Valiant but unsuccessful efforts were made to revive him when he was discovered.
