

## ***Disability Related Employment Supports***

Disability Related Employment Supports (DRES) help Albertans overcome the disability-related barriers to their education, career and employment goals.

### **DRES can help in three ways:**

#### **1. Job-search supports**

Job-search supports like sign-language interpreters, software rentals and technical device rentals may be provided to help Albertans with disabilities attend job-search workshops and job interviews.

#### **2. Workplace supports**

Workplace supports help Albertans with disabilities make successful transitions into the workplace and maintain their employment. Supports can include sign worksite modifications, sign-language interpreters or assistive technology to help the Albertan succeed at work.

#### **3. Educational supports**

Education supports can include sign language interpreters, tutors, and note takers. Assistive technology may also be provided, including software programs specific to their disability.

### **Eligibility**

To qualify, the applicant must:

- Be an Alberta resident;
- Be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident of Canada, or refugee under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act;
- Be legally entitled to work/train in Canada;
- Have a documented permanent disability that creates a barrier to employment or education needed to obtain employment;
- Develop a plan that will lead to employment;
- Be employment-destined and be able to work at least 15 hours per week, earning minimum wage; and
- Not be eligible for other funding to cover the costs of these supports.
