Under Chief Medical Officer of Health (CMOH) Order 07-2020 dated March 27, 2020, <u>health professionals can offer or</u> <u>provide non-essential health services at a</u> <u>place of business only if the services are</u> <u>deemed urgent by the health professional</u> <u>providing the service</u>. If applicable, please seek guidance from your professional college or association. The CMOH order also states <u>a non-</u> <u>essential health service includes any</u> <u>service that is generally done to protect,</u> <u>promote or maintain health of an individual</u> <u>and where an interruption in the provision of</u> <u>service **will not** result in an individual's life, <u>health or safety being immediately</u> <u>endangered.</u></u>
